

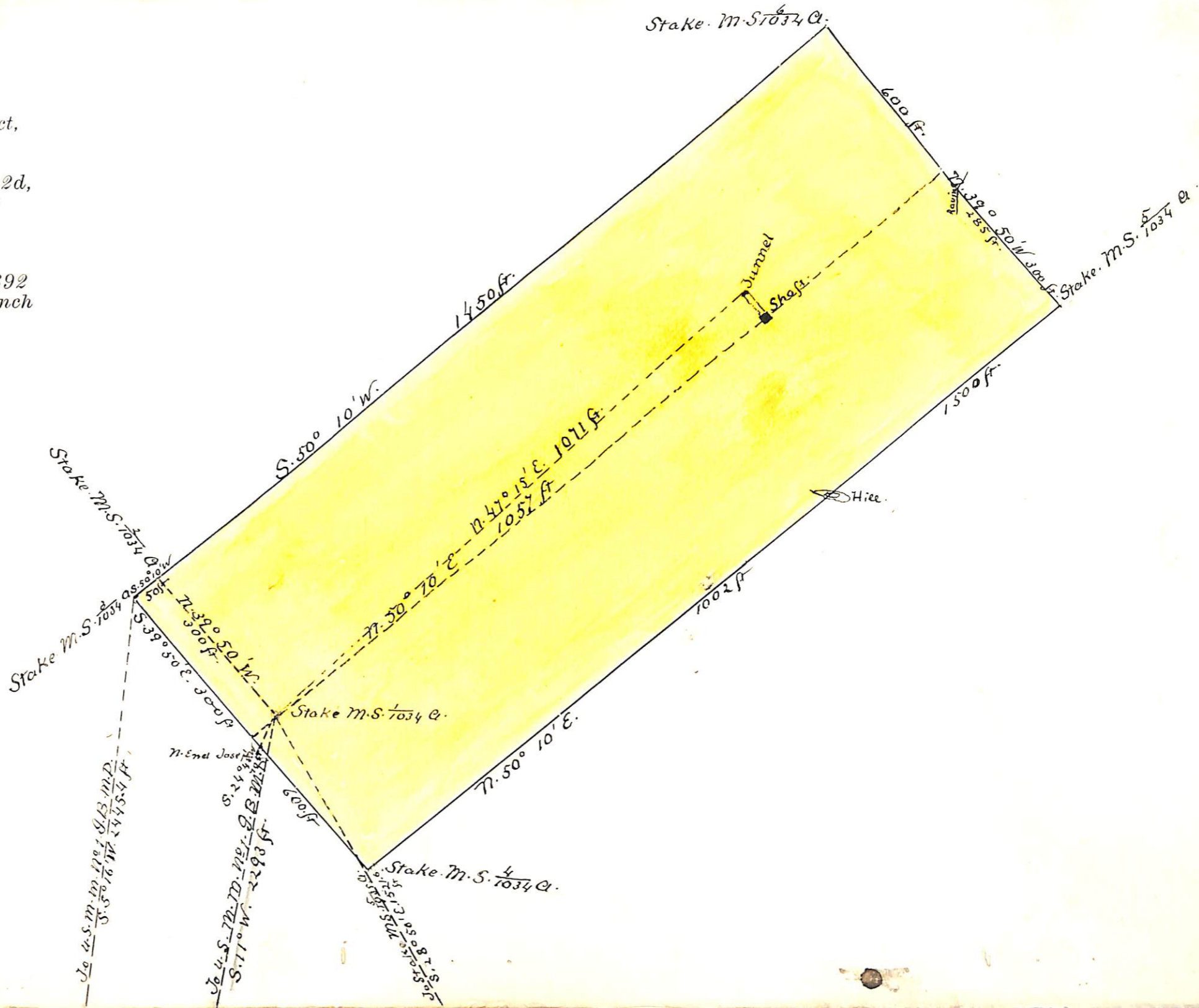

Plat of the Southern Pride Lode.

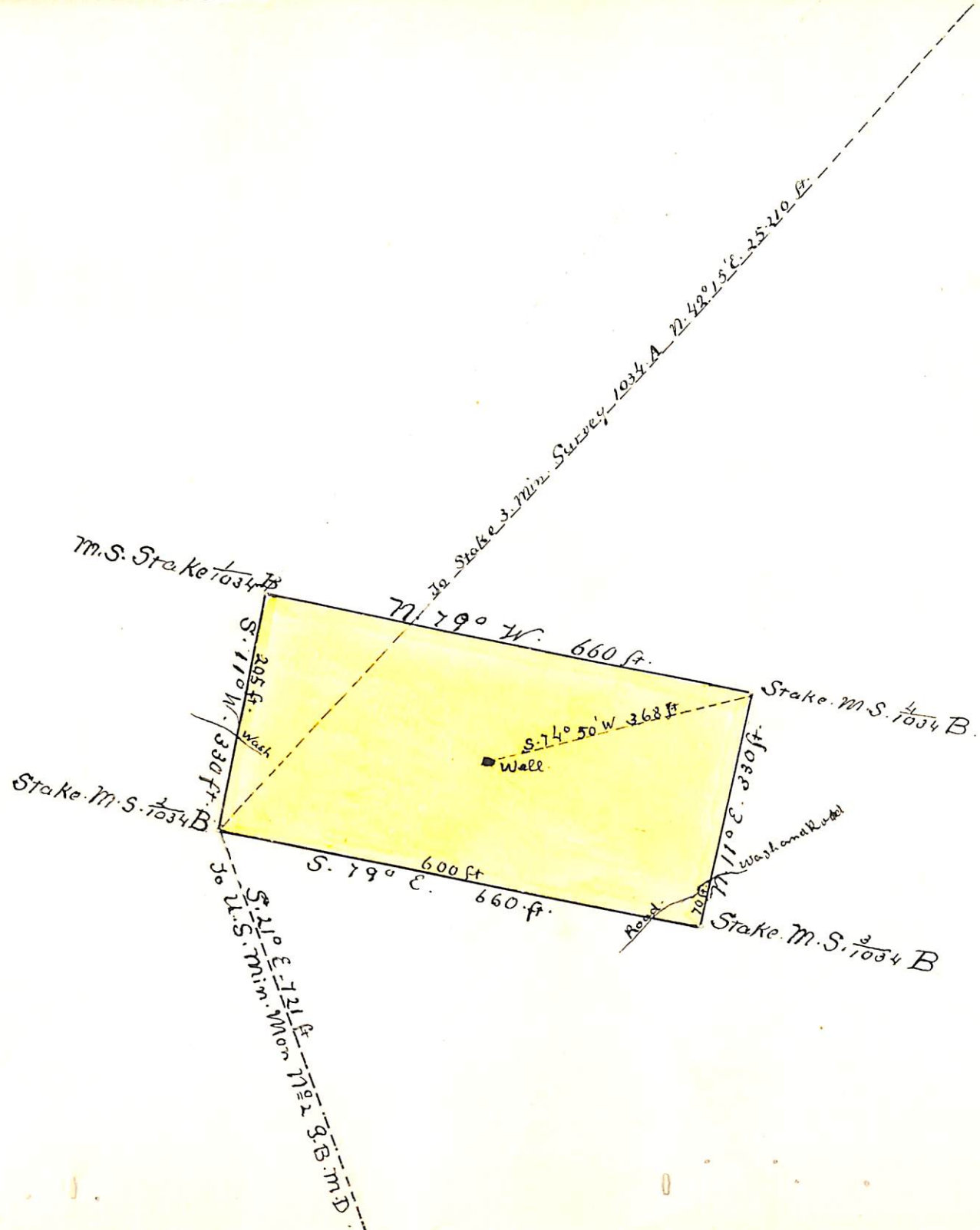
