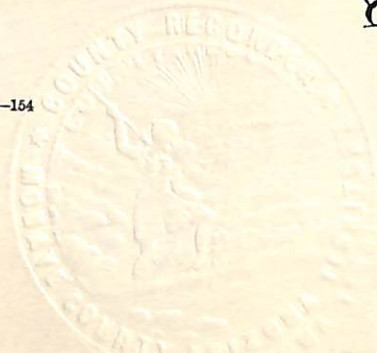

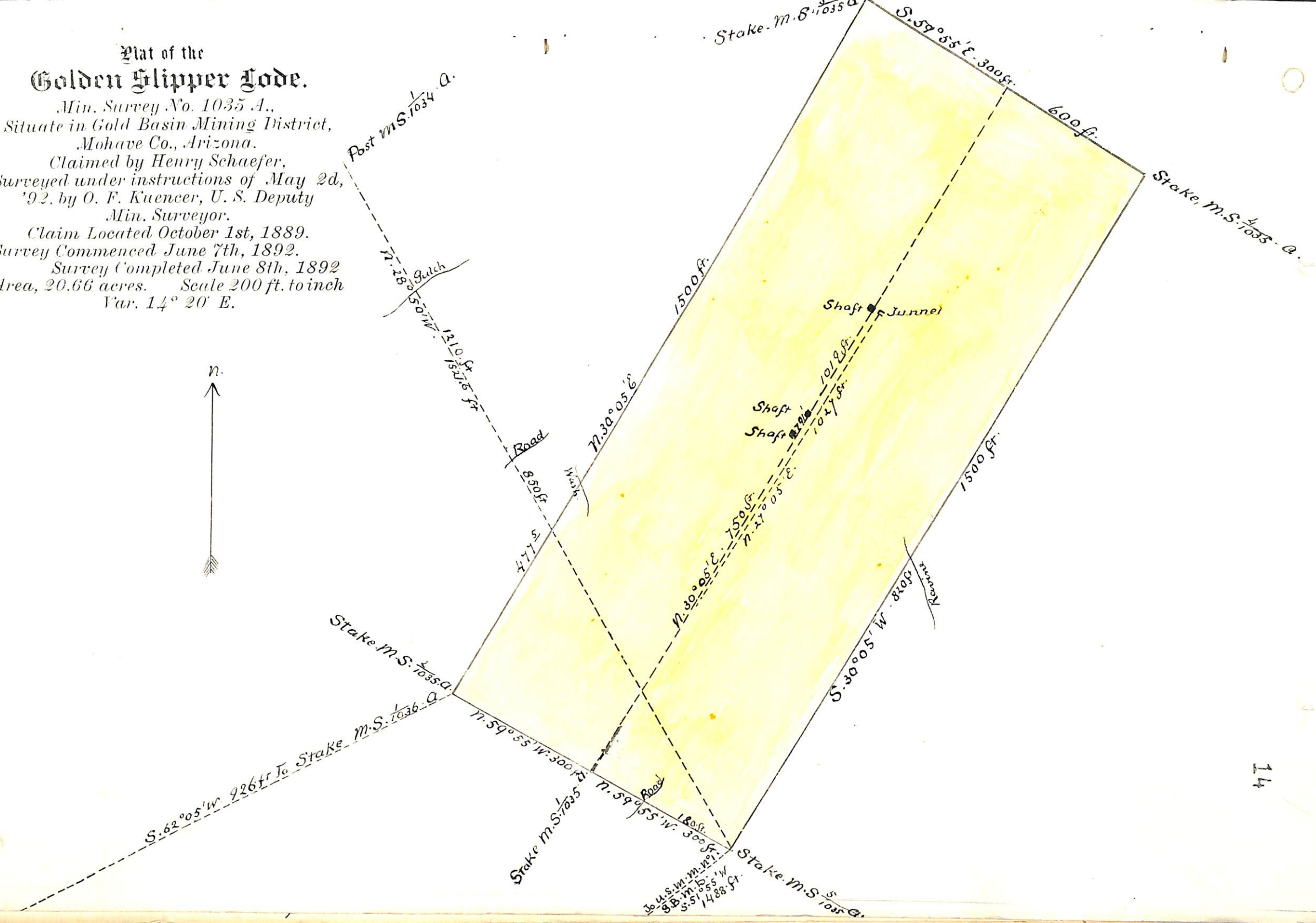

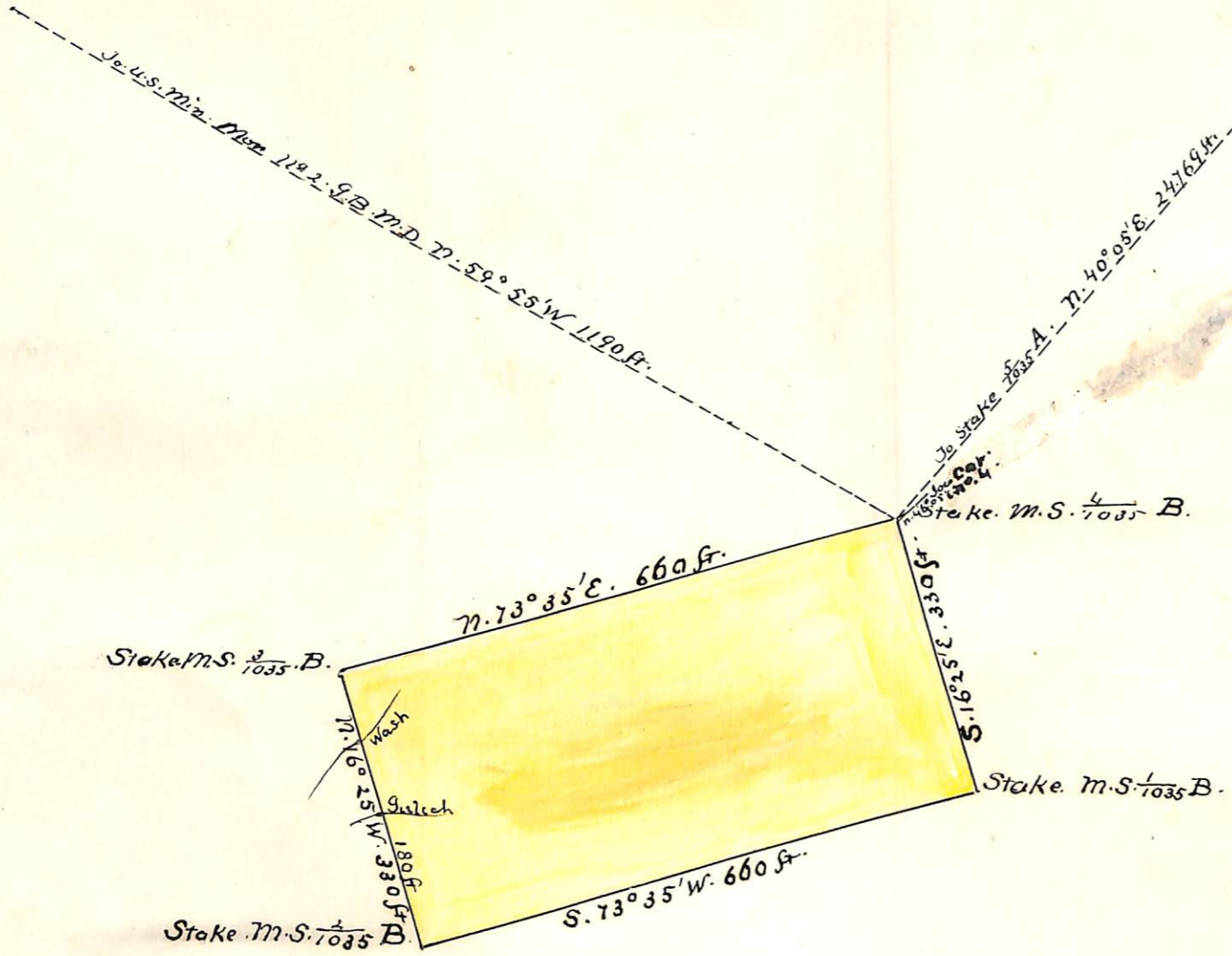
Plat of the Golden Slipper Lode.
