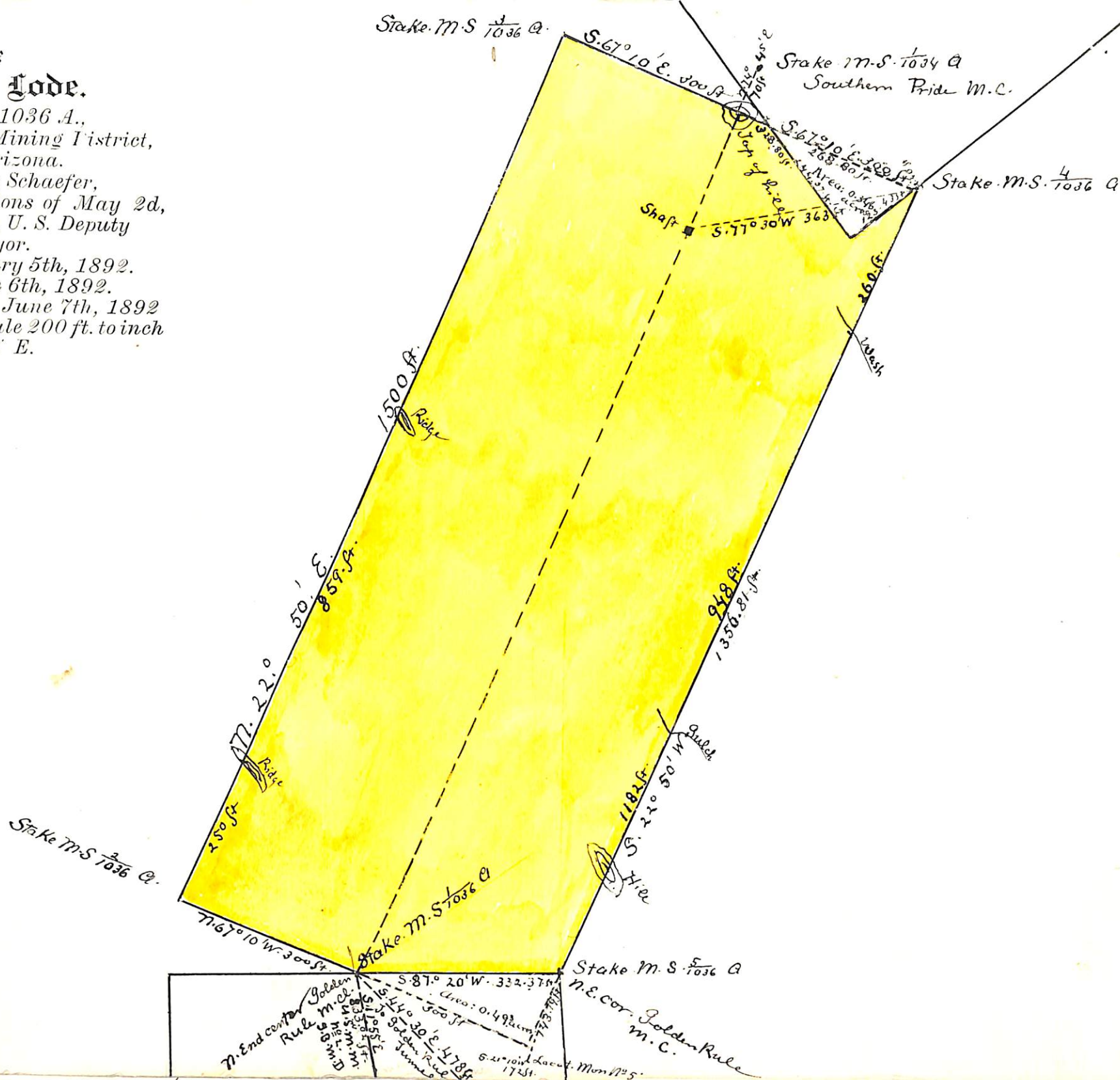


**Plat of the  
Josephine Lode.**

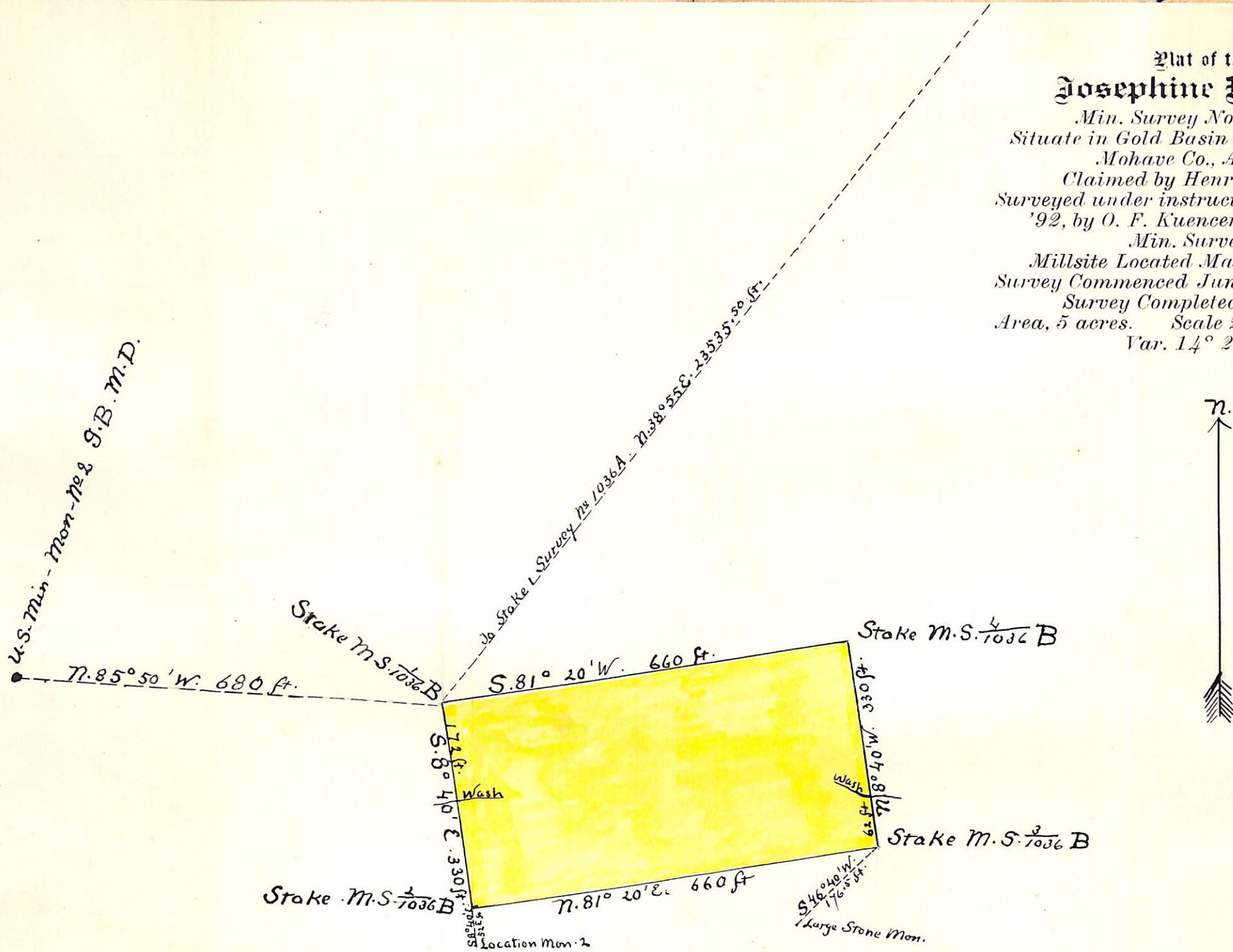
