That Jno.S.Jones of the County of Yavapai, in the Territory of Arizona, claims by right of discovery and location, Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet linear and horizontal measurement on the Yavapai Lode, along the vein thereof, with all its dips, variations and angles; together with Three hundred (300) feet in width on each side of the middle of said vein at the surface; and all veins, lodes ledges, deposits and surface ground within the lines of said claim; 1500 feet on said lode running North east from the center of the discovery shaft.

Said claim is situated on the Chaparral Gulch in Big Bug Mining District, County of Yavapai and Territory of Arizona, and is bounded and described as follows;

Beginning at Cor.No.1, which is the south west corner of claim and also the North-^{East}~~west~~ corner of the Arizona Mining Claim; thence North-easterly 1500 feet to Cor No 2; thence South-easterly 600 feet to Cor.No.3, thence south-westerly 1500 feet to Cor.No.4, which is the North east corner of the Arizona Claim; thence in a north-westerly course 300 feet to center of discovery shaft, 600 feet to Cor.No.1, the place of beginning.



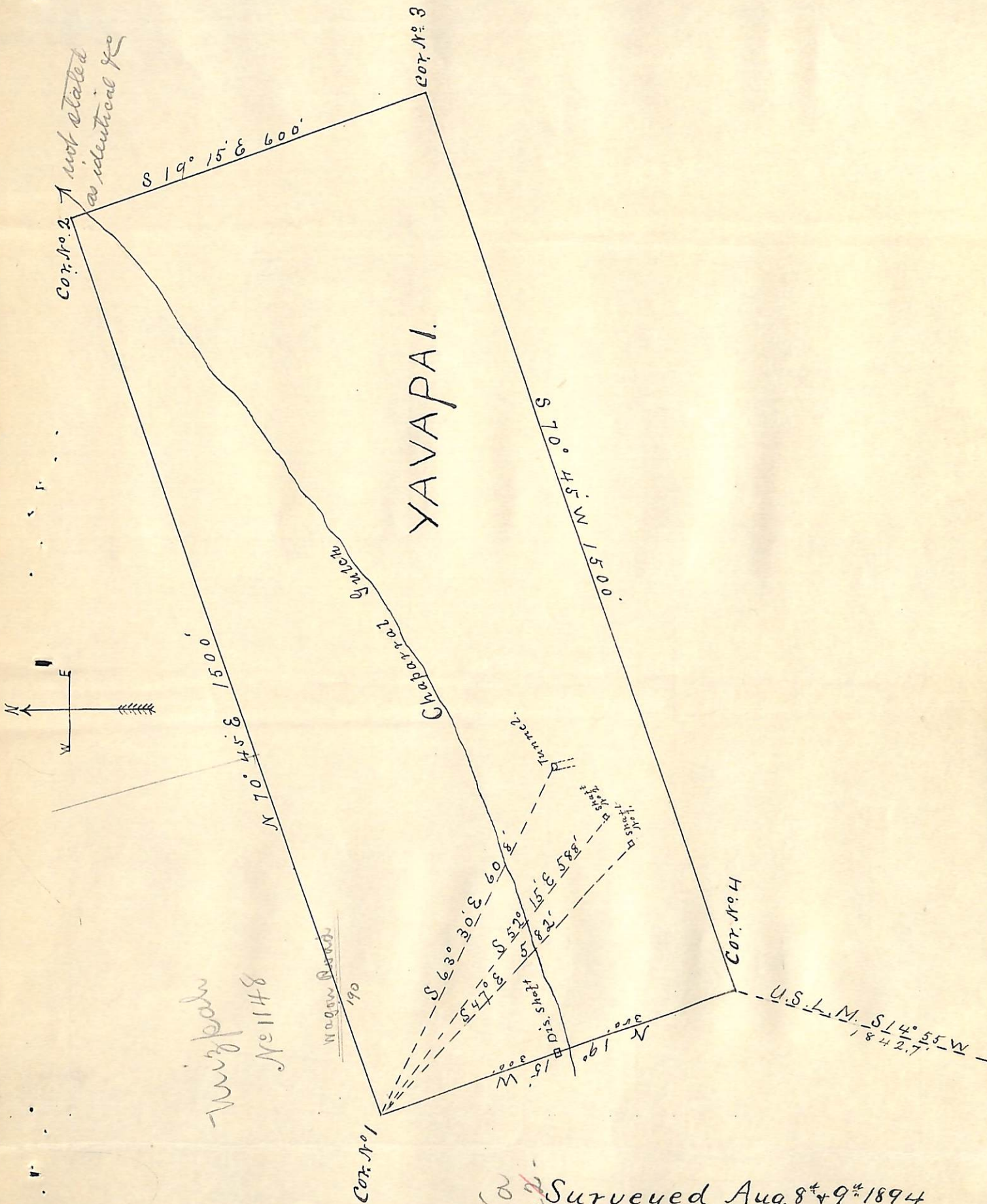
