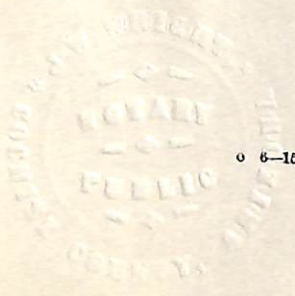

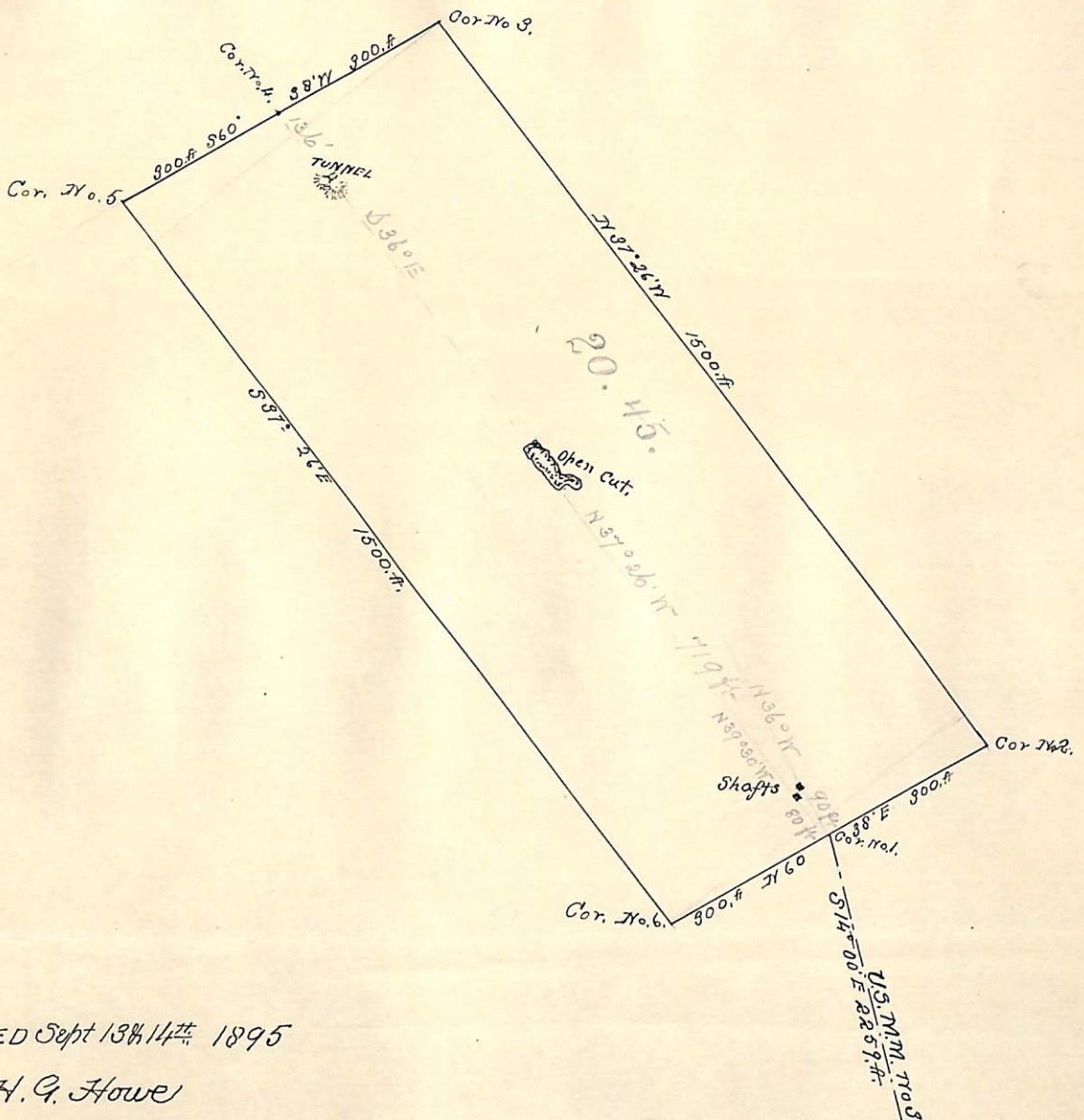




WHITE TAILED DEER LODGE
