R. C. Powers, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:
I now reside in Los Angeles, California. I formerly resided
at prescott, Arizona and was then a deputy United States Mineral
Surveyor. As such surveyor I was employed by James M. More
to make a survey for a patent of the Buckeye Lode Mining Claim,
known as M.E. 286 at the Prescott, Arizona Land Office.

At the time of making the survey, Mr. More was not present
He was unable ~~xx~~ to attend the survey. He gave me a description
of the work which he had done under his Burckeye Location and
of the work generally done on the claim. It was sometime after
this conversation before the survey was actually made and since
that time I have been informed that a confusion arose in my
mind as to the work done by Mr. More under his location and
the work which had been previously done and that in making my
return of the \$500. worth of work done I included work which
had been ~~previously~~ done previous to the location by Mr. More.
Since then I have been informed as to the work done by Mr. More
subsequent to his location of the Buckeye claim and previous
to the expiration of the period of p ublication of his Notice
of Application for a Patent under his said entry, and know
its location, extent and value. I was a witness upon the trial
of the contest involving said entry between A. W. Armstrong and
others, contestants, v. James M. More, entryman, involving the

above mentioned Mineral Entry which testimony, I think, was given about the 23rd or 24th day of November, 1901 and I now make this affidavit for the purpose of correcting the description of the improvements in my return to the surveyor general of the description, extent and value of the improvements made by Mr. More under his Buckeye Location.

His work consisted of a tunnel run into the side of the mountain within the boundaries of the Buckeye claim, near the initial monument, fourteen or fifteen feet long. Two cuts, one twenty feet in length on the north hillside opposite the initial monument and about fifty rods therefrom, and the other one across the gulch, with a face of about fifteen to twenty feet. A little lower down the hill was another cut fifteen feet long with a breast of about ten feet at the back end. There was a shaft Four by six feet by twenty feet deep situated about twenty yards over the top of the north hill from the initial monument and well within the boundaries of the Buckeye Lode Mining Claim a patent for which is applied for. I estimate the value of said work, labor and improvements to be at least Five Hundred ²⁵ Twenty Dollars.
