NOTICE OF LOCATION.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:--

That I the undersigned have this day located fifteen hundred (1500) feet in length by six hundred (600) feet in width of this horizontal ore deposit or lode, bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles, variations and all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of this claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of the United States Mining Laws, under which it is located.

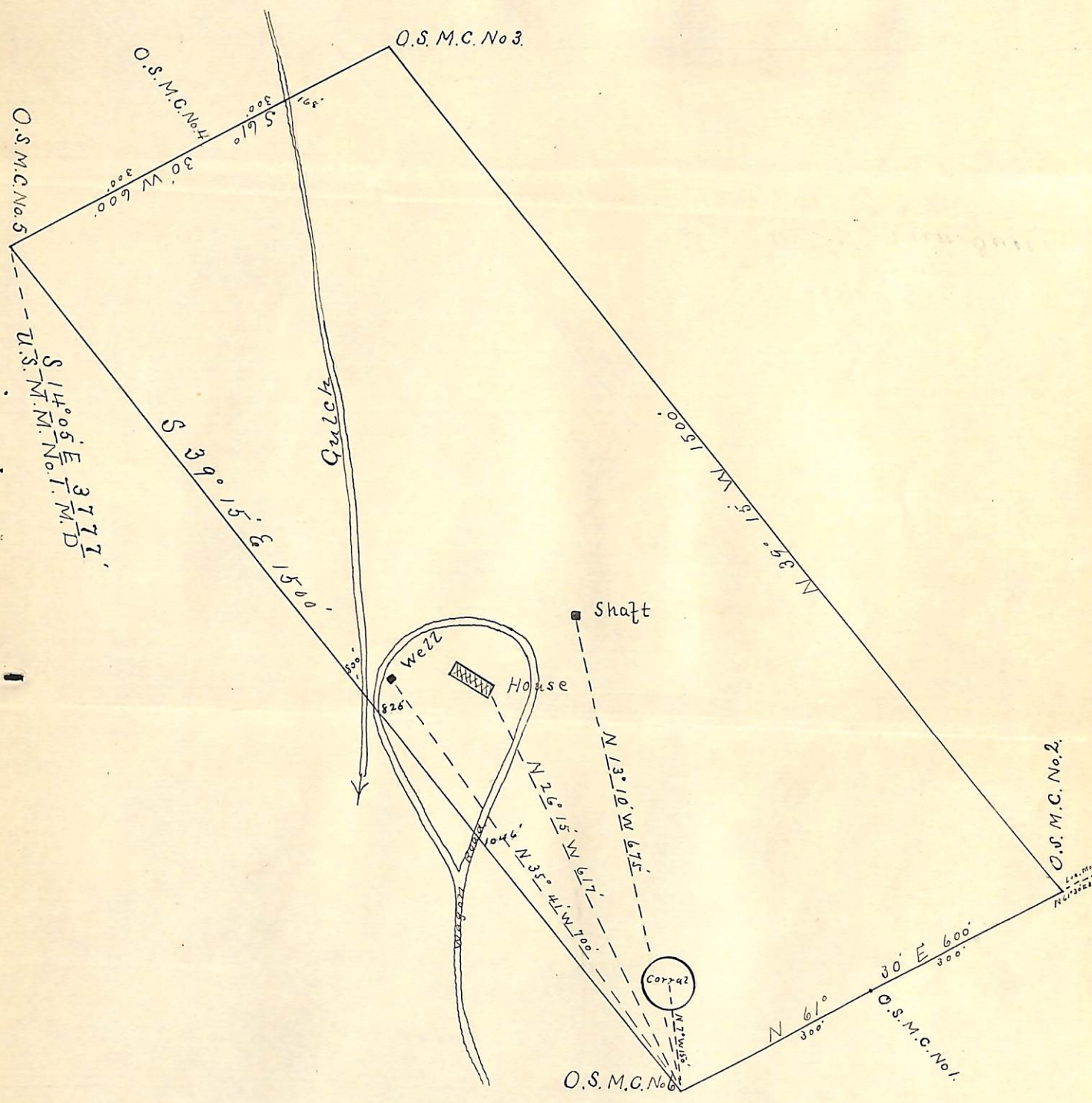
