The survey was made with a Gurley solar transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observations. The distances were measured with a 100 foot steel chain. The true meridian was obtained with the solar compass.

U.S.L.M. No 2, Castle Creek District

There being no corner of the public survey or U.S. location now, within two miles of the Washington Lode, Survey No 1198 I established a U.S.L.M. on a prominent peak, known as Lookout Peak. A conical peak about 50 feet in diameter on top, which is visible for a long distance in every direction. In the center of which I chiseled a + for center point on solid granite rock in place and U.S.L.M. No 2, C.C.D. and along side of which I built a conical monument of stones 6 foot base and 5 feet high. From which a + on granite rock in place bears N 39° W 19.5 feet, marked B.B. U.S.L.M. No 2, C.C.D.

A + on granite rock in place, marked B.B. U.S.L.M. No 2, C.C.D., bears N 72° 6' E 34.5 feet.

Bugards Roost gulch is about 1500 ft north of Mon.

Whip saw Gulch is about 3000 feet south. Briggs P.C. is about 3 miles East. Hot Spring on Castle Creek is about 10 miles south.

White Peaches Mt bears S 30° 55' W The most easterly of the Four Peaks bears S 69° 48' E.

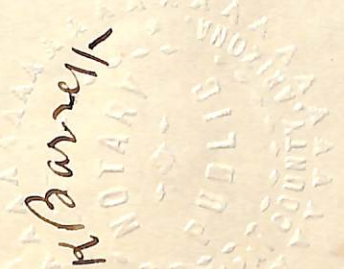

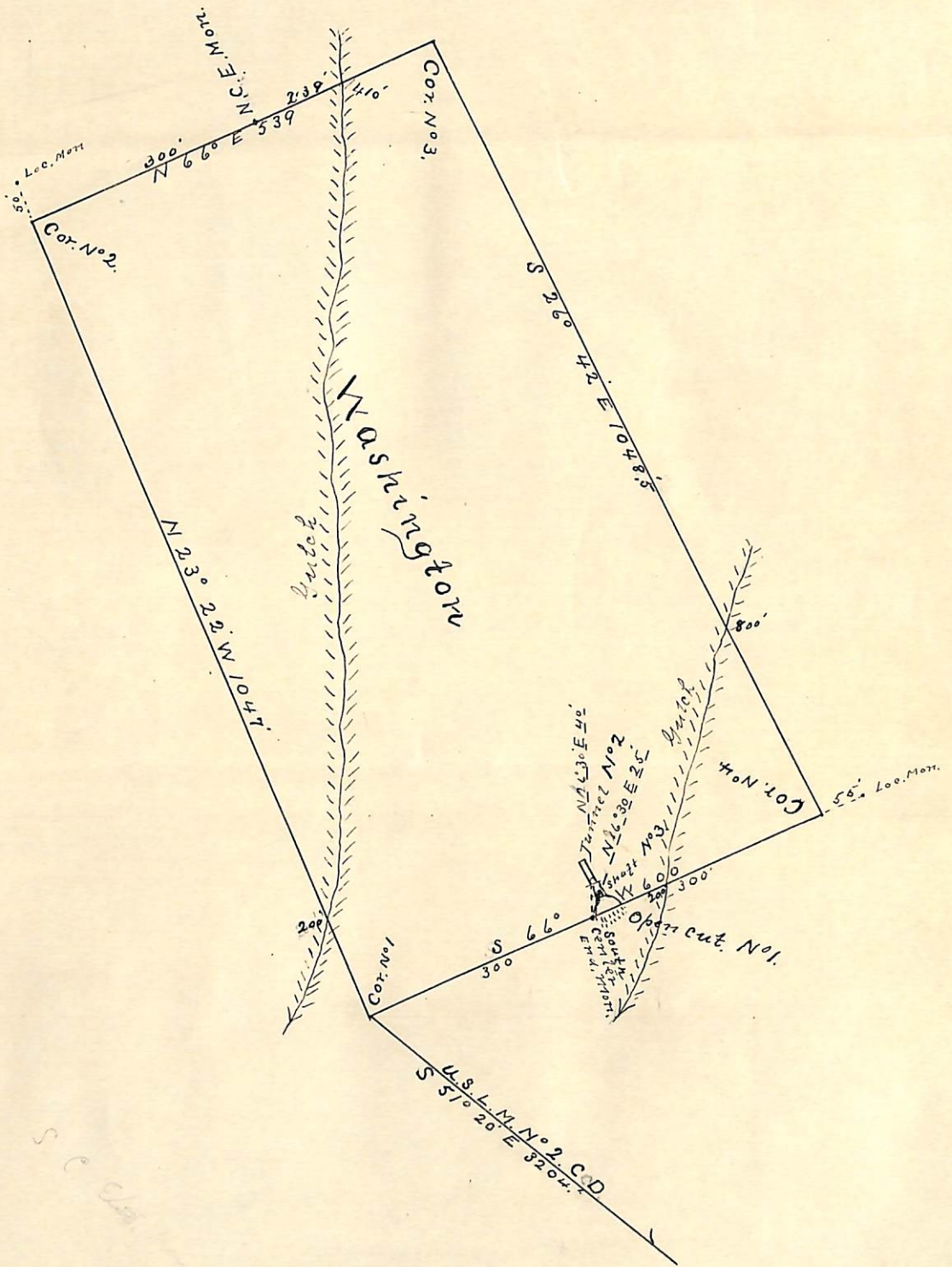
