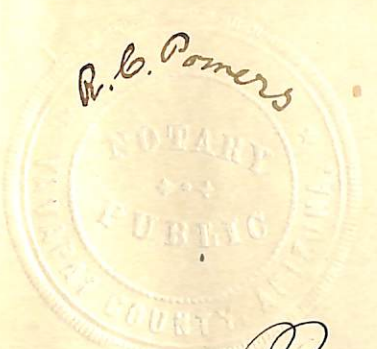
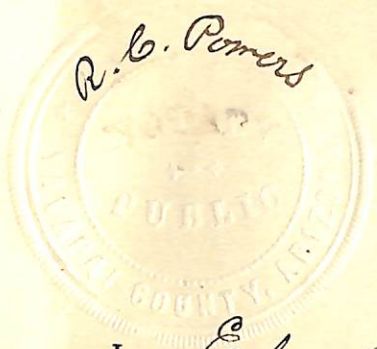

At 11 h 06.7 m P.M. local mean time Nov 10th 1896, I observed Polaris at Eastern elongation in accordance with instructions in the Manual of Instructions and marked the line thus determined by a tack driven in a peg of wood five chains N. of my station.

At 6 a.m. ~~July 26th~~ 1896, I lay off & lay off the azimuth of Polaris $1^{\circ} 30.6'$ and mark the meridian thus determined by cutting a mark on a rock in place west of the point established last night.

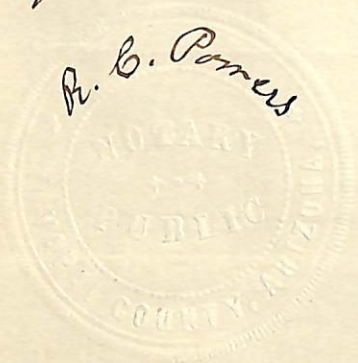

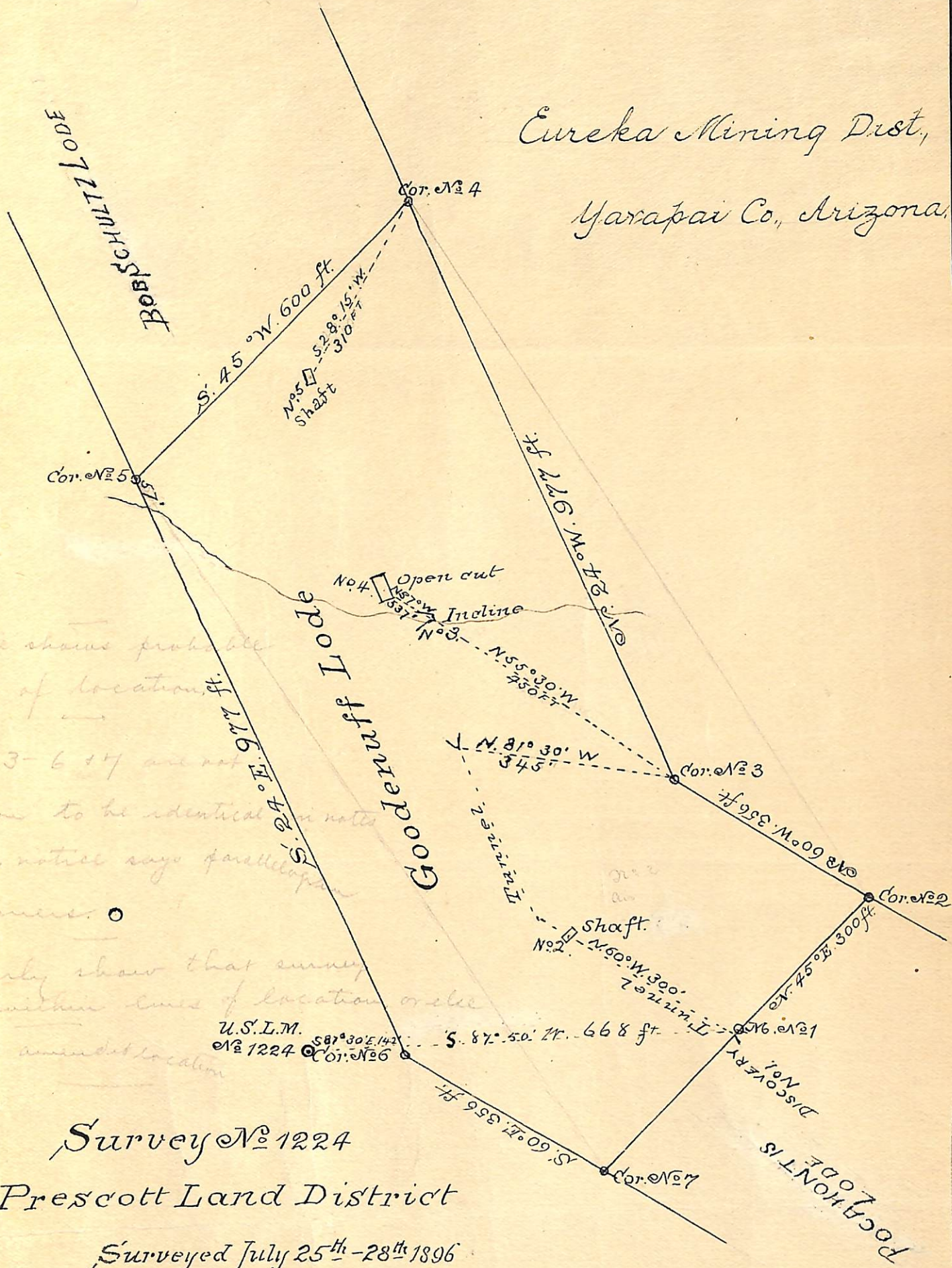

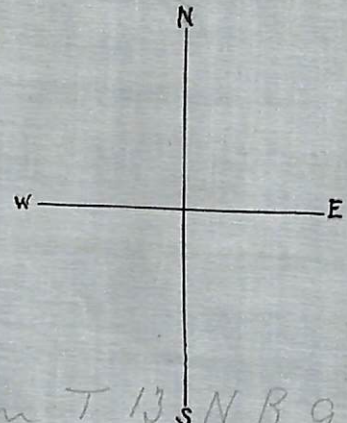
