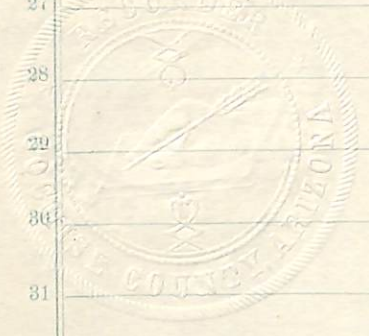

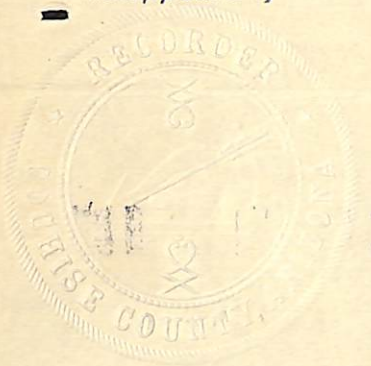

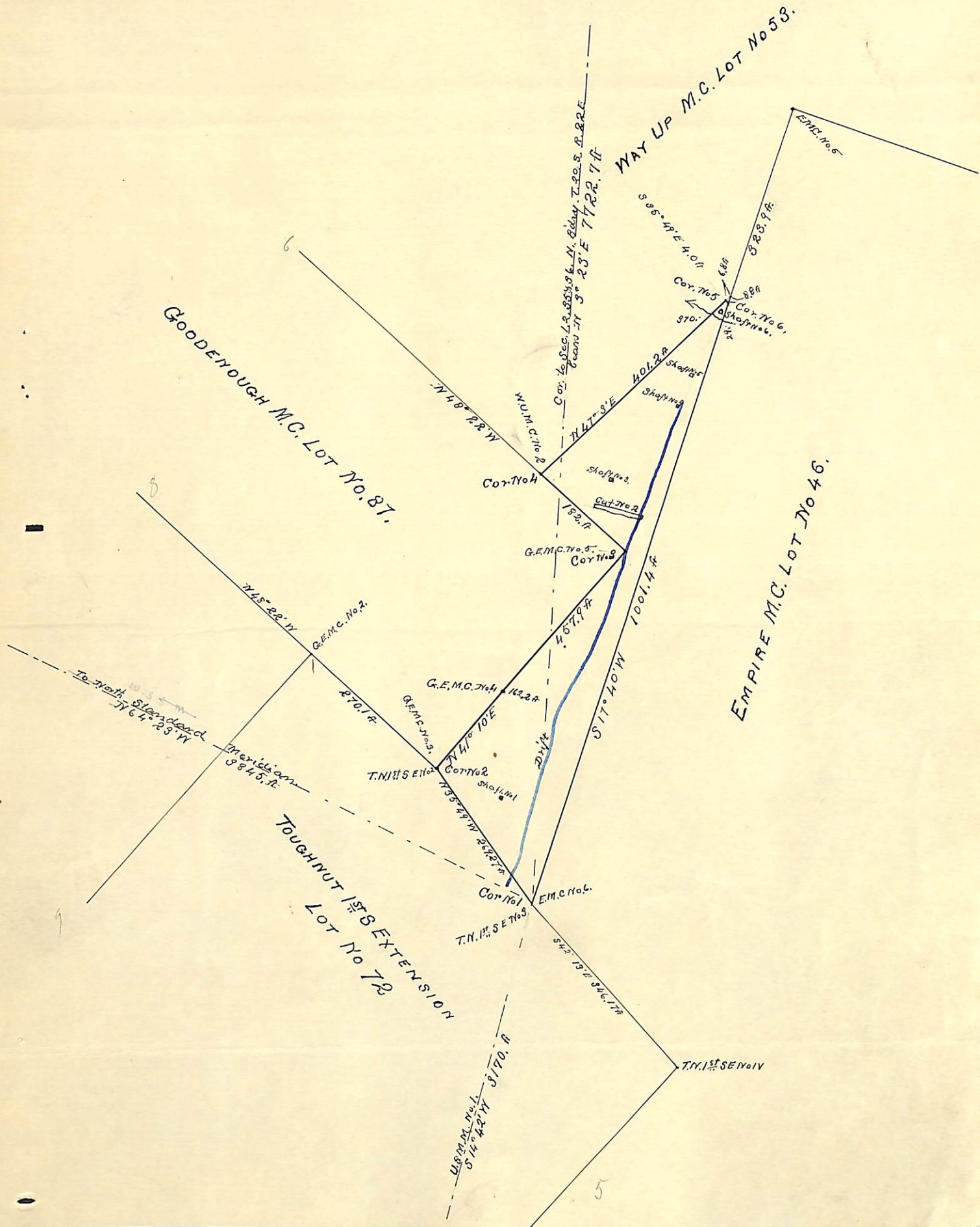


Amended Location Notice

The AZTEC lode claim was originally surveyed under Mineral Survey No. 1130 and was subsequently surveyed under Mineral Survey No. 3886.

This memorandum cancels the surveys of the AZTEC lode claim under both M.S. #1130 and M.S. #3886.

The following notation should be made on the plat of Mineral Survey No. 1130 and the plat of Mineral Survey No. 3886:

"Survey of AZTEC lode claim canceled by State Director's memorandum dated May 31, 1972."

The plats and field notes of both surveys should remain in the files. The original of this memorandum should be made a part of the original field notes of Mineral Survey No. 1130 and the carbon copy of this memorandum should be made a part of the original field notes of Mineral Survey No. 3886.

The Aztec lode claim was relinquished October 16, 1967, in order to qualify patenting a parcel of land under the Mining Claim Occupancy Act. On August 3, 1970, Patent No. 02-71-0004 was issued embracing a portion of the lands within the Aztec lode claim.
