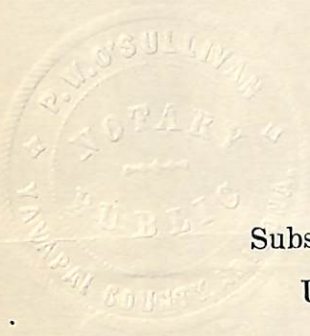

NOTICE OF LOCATION:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:
