true meridian.

As per instructions of Dec 11th/97
Upon the afternoon of Dec 15th, 1897.
I select a point 14 ft. east of the S.E.
cor. of the adobe house situated
about $\frac{1}{4}$ a mile south of Copper
Canyon, where I drive a peg firmly
in the ground, the center plainly
marked, over which I set a young
and sons light mountain transit
No 5585, with Smith's solar attachment
carefully adjusted for this latitude
and hour of the day. At 300 ft north
of this I have another peg driven and
mark the point cut by the vertical
hair cut by the telescope.

At 1:36 A.M. I obtain an observation
of Polaris at its greatest western elonga-
tion in accordance with the Manual
of instructions and mark the point
thus determined upon a peg driven
in the ground at the north end of
meridian.

Upon the morning of the 16th of Dec.
at 8 A.M.

I lay off the Azimuth of Polaris 1° 27' to
the east and mark the True Meri-
dian thus determined, which falls
upon the same peg set by me upon
the afternoon of Dec 15th.

And I find the mean Magnetic
declination to be 12° 20' E

Establishment of U.S. L.M. No. 1274.

Field Notes of the establishment of U.S. L.M. No 1274. at the head of Copper, Montezuma, and Ash Canons.

I find upon examination of the location of the Samson, War Up, Boston, and State of Texas Mining Claims, that I have received instructions to Survey under date of Dec 11th/97 that said claims lay upon both sides of the Huachuca Mountains and not in any established Mining District. And no public Surveys or International monuments within the prescribed limits of two miles.

I go to the highest sharp point upon the divide at the head of Copper Canon to the South west. The Montezuma Canon to the east, and the Ash Canon to the North east. From this point the entire country for miles can be seen.






PLAT OF THE
