The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 steel tapes.


Note: The intersections noted above were determined by running said lines from corner to corner.

The disagreements between these field notes and those of surrounding patented ground are due to errors in the latter. I checked all courses by re-running lines,

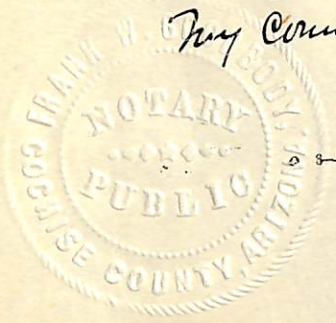

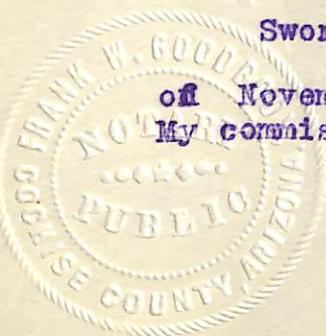

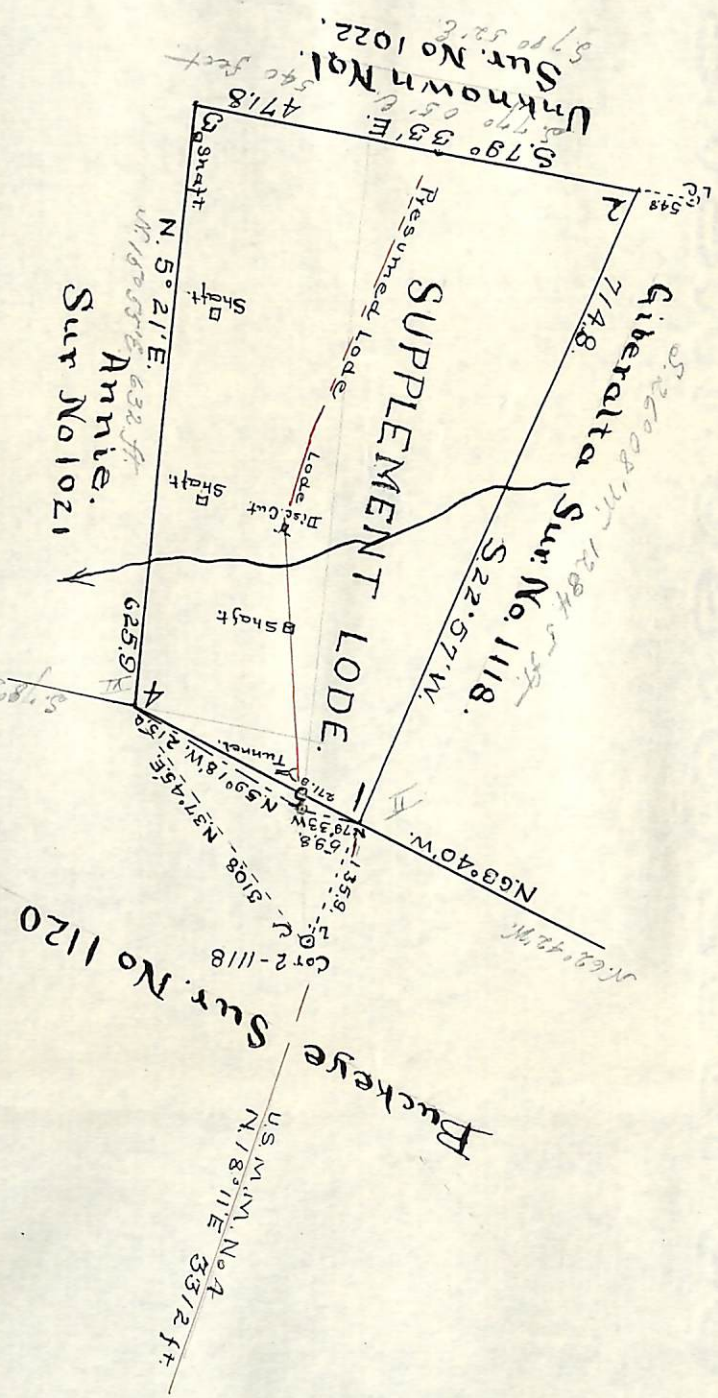
