Surveys No. 1294 and 1295, are made by The Nicholson Gold Mining Company, who are also the owners of the Portmanteau, Survey No. 1181. All work is designed to develop the entire group of six claims.

The greater amount of work for a general development on account of existing conditions has been done on the Portmanteau, which has some 3000 feet of underground work at present. All buildings on the property are on the Portmanteau ground, and consist of a frame kitchen and dining room, office, assay shop, a stone and lumber bunk house, frame blacksmith shop, frame stable, trails well built to the tunnels, and other workings, a wagon road of two and one half miles, a great part of which is a dug way grade. All improvements are well constructed.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Engineers' transit. Courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured by a 50 and 100 ft. steel chain.






