- a The soil of this claim throughout its entire extent is composed of sand gravel and boulders washed down from surrounding mountains. There is no timber here and only scattering low brush and scant grass upon the surface.
- b Antelope Creek that begins about three miles north easterly from the claim passes through to and across the West boundary line of the claim as shown upon the accompanying plan. It varies in width across the bottom from 30 to 80 feet and flows in a southerly direction.
