"GOOD ENOUGH"

AMENDED LOCATION "GOOD ENOUGH" MINING CLAIM.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS; that we, the undersigned, in compliance with the mining acts of Congress approved May 10th 1872, and all subsequent Acts and with the laws of the Territory of Arizona with regard to the location of mining claims and the amending thereof, have this 29th day of November 1899, amended, located and claimed, and by these presents do amend locate and claim by right of discovery and amended location, 1500 linear feet on this the "Good Enough" lode, lode, vein or deposit, along the course thereof, being 750 feet in a Westerly direction and 750 feet in an Easterly direction lengthwise of the claim from the center of the discovery shaft, where this notice is posted, in so far as can be determined by present developments, together with 300 feet in width of the surface ground on either side of the center of said lead ledge lode vein or deposit at the surface, together with all dips spurs variations and all leads, lodes ledges or veins within the boundaries of said claim in Verde Mining District in Yavapai County, the boundaries of said claim being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

NOTICE OF LOCATION.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That I the undersigned have this day re-located 1500 feet of this vein or lode, bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, with surface ground 300 feet on each side of vein, with all mineral deposits contained therein and all timber and water thereon or appurtenant thereto, according to the provisions of the United States Mining Laws.

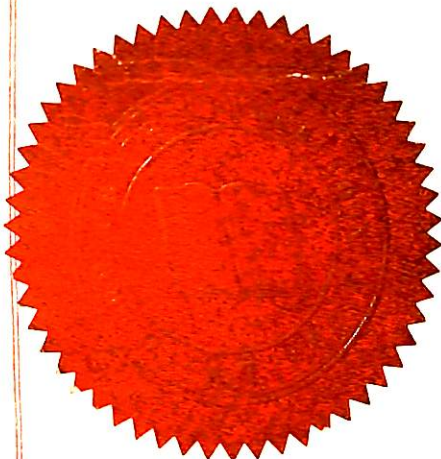

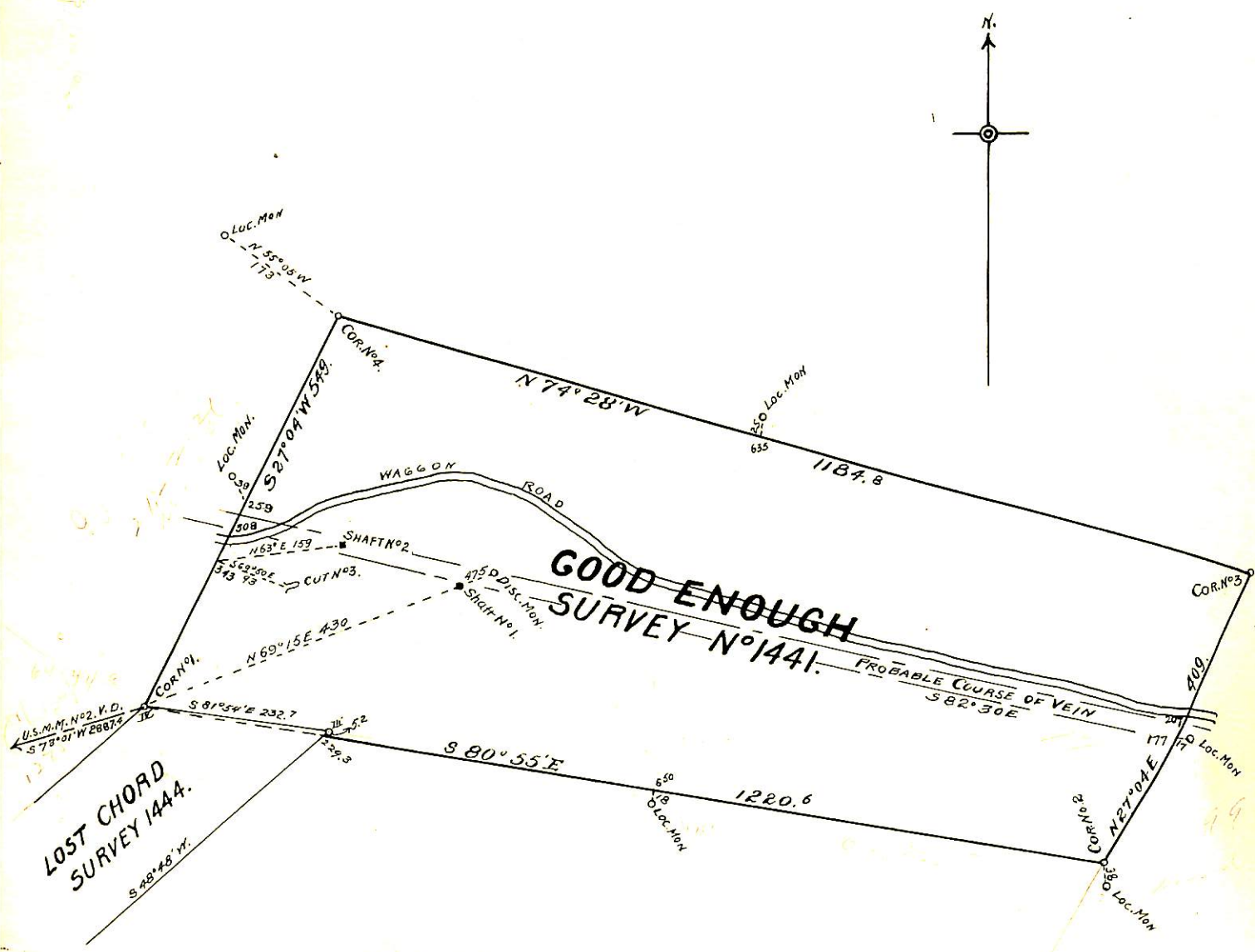
