This mining claim, the name of which is the De La Fountaine Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by W. C. Bishop, a citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the 29th day of May, 1899,. The length of this claim is Fifteen hundred feet, and I claim Eight hundred and fifty feet in an Easterly direction and Six hundred and fifty feet in a Westerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three Hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the ~~xxxxxx~~ center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the East to the West. The claim is situated and located in the Wallapai Mining District, in Mohave County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one and one half miles in a Northeasterly direction from Cerbat and adjoins the Henrietta Mining Claim on the West. 


