I certify that while the mouth of discovery tunnel, Arizona side is 4 ft. on the Terreras side, survey N<sup>o</sup> 1229, it was with the full consent and knowledge of claimants of Terreras side and due to the fact that Cor N<sup>o</sup> 3-1229 Terreras side was never established, or if so it has been entirely obliterated, and the claimants of the said Terreras side being under the impression that Cor N<sup>o</sup> 3-1229 laid east about 300 ft and north about 150 ft. from present Cor N<sup>o</sup> 3-1229.

Therefore I considered that the Arizona side be credited with full amount

at Discovery Tunnel, as this tunnel is intended for main adit and the claimant has the full consent and knowledge of the claimants of the Terranas lode Survey No 1229 to proceed with development of said tunnel.

The fact that Cor. 7-23-1229 having been entirely obliterated, if ever set, necessitated the filing of an "amended location certificate", and an "additional and amended location certificate" of the Arizona lode.

The surface embraced by the Arizona and New Mexico lodes, is about 800 ft higher than Chases Creek. North side line of the Arizona lode is very rough and broken. Cor 1 is about 250 ft lower than Cor 4-1 which is on apex of ridge, which follows the south side line of Arizona for about 1000 ft then turns, running direct for Cor 1 shaft. A hot spring is on the apex of said ridge, dividing the west fork of Chases Creek and the north fork of Yankee Gulch.

Discovery channel which is on the north slope of ridge if continued in its present course will tap shaft No 2, which is on the south slope, about 150 ft deep, said shaft being about 75 ft lower than apex of ridge in direct course of tunnel. - Adjoining claims

The Terranas Lode Survey No 1229, is owned by The Arizona Copper Company of Clifton.

To the north of the Arizona lode and to the west of the Terranas lode the ground is owned by A. D. McLean of Metcalfe

The claimants, if any, to the west of the Arizona Lode and the New Mexico Lodes are unknown.

The Mohican, North Dakota La Maria, El Capitan, and Omeda Survey 1033A, are owned by the Detroit Copper Mining Company of Monroe.

The Eureka and Mexican Lodes Survey 78, on the east of Arizona and New Mexico Lodes, are owned by L.C. Passant and others.

Judging from present developments and surface indications the ledges of both the Arizona and New Mexico Lodes extends throughout the entire of their respective claims.

In making this survey particular attention was paid to the East and West of the Arizona and New Mexico Lodes being identical with a portion of the West and lines of Eureka and Mexican Lodes, Survey 78, and I find the courses and distances herein stated to be correct.

Costs were set at the respective intersections of the Terranas Lode Survey N.E., 229 and North Dakota Lodes (unsurveyed) by request of the claimants to avoid any further controversy as to the location of their respective lines and points of intersections.

Note - The disagreement between the field notes and the original location certificate of the Arizona Lode, with respect to the course of side lines, is due to the fact

that the monuments were so placed that in producing the side lines I found a portion of the work was entirely outside of the boundaries of said claim, and as the ground to the north and south of said claim was vacant, July 3-1900, an amended location certificate was filed.

The disagreement between the amended location certificate and the "Further and Amended Location Certificate" is due to errors in the amended location certificate, caused by a misunderstanding as to the exact position of Cor 3-1229, said corner being entirely obliterated if not established.

I do not submit

a C. L. Berger and Sons, Mining  
Transit. The courses were  
deflected from the true meridian,  
as determined by direct observation  
on the Polaris. The distances  
were measured with a 200. foot tape.


