### Instrument

This survey was made with a Feller and Brightley Transit with solar attachment, which was used in deflecting the courses. The distances were measured with a 500-foot steel tape and a 50-foot chain.

Note. The plat of this lode claim is drawn on a scale of 300 feet to one inch in order to get the three claims, forming the group on the proper size paper.

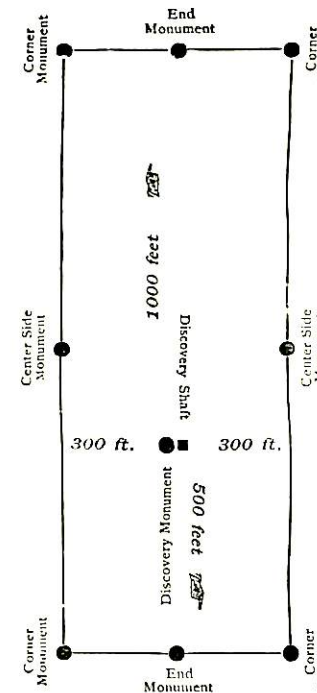

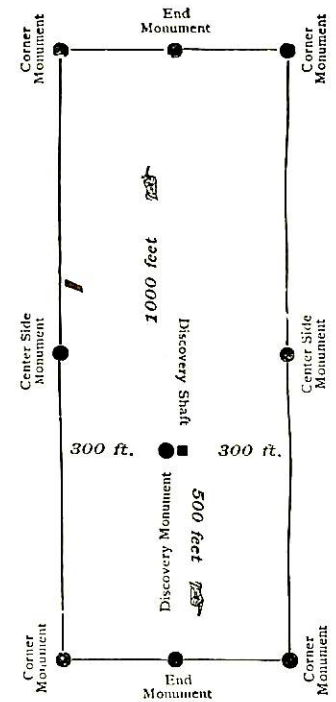
