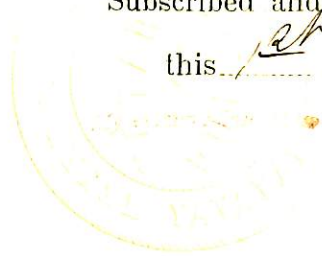

NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.

Quartz Claim.

To all whom it may concern. 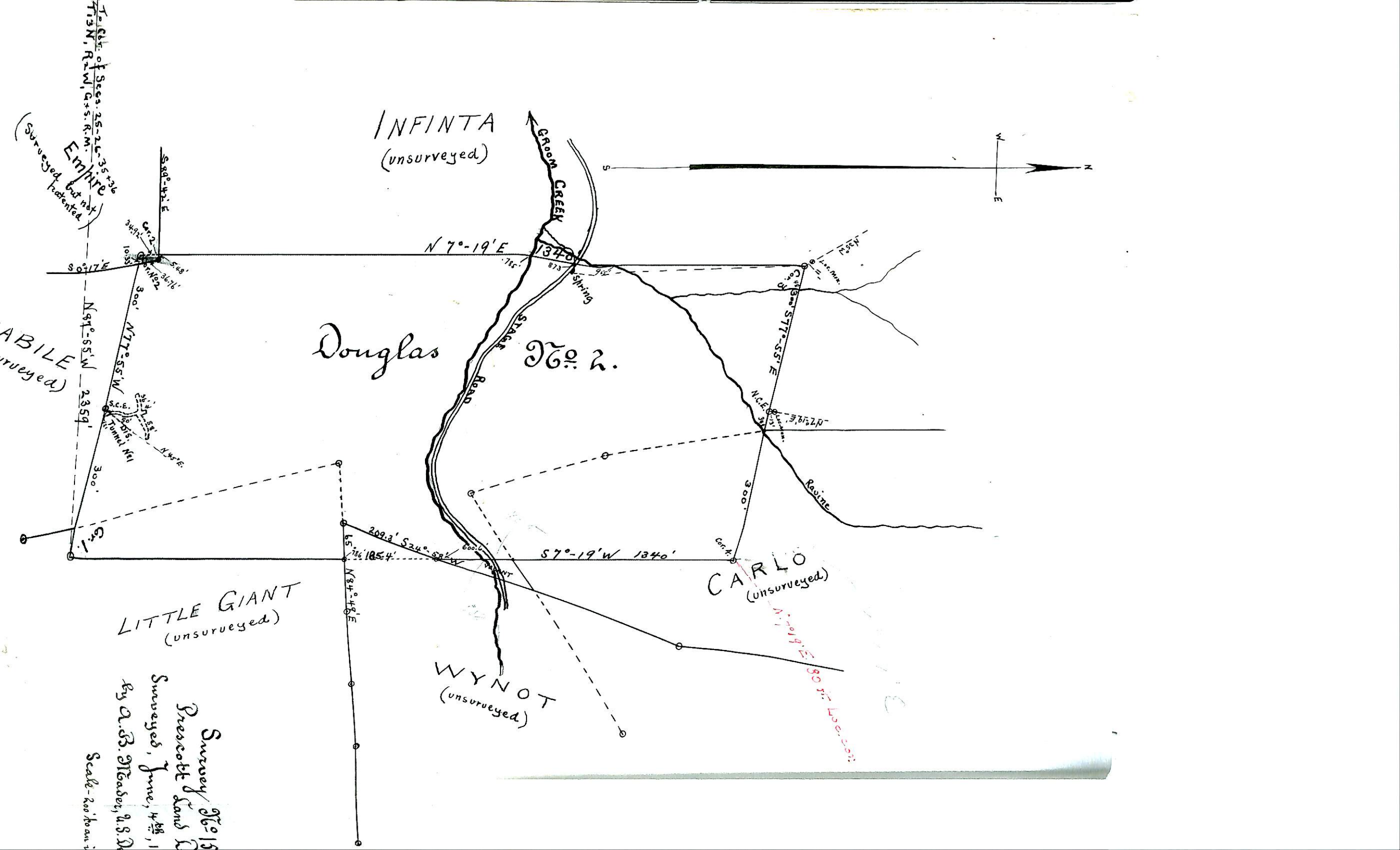
