On my instructions of Sept. 26th 1901, there being no public corner or U.S. Loc. monument, within two miles of this claim to be surveyed, on Feb. 1st 1902, with three assistants, I go to the highest hill north east of the Pioneer well, a point overlooking the greater part of the surrounding country, and after excavating to a depth of 18 inches, down to solid bedrock, I have chiseled into this bedrock a cross 4 ins. long due North and South, and 3 ins. long East and west.

Over this point I carefully placed a Basalt stone, (32 x 8 x 15 inches, chiseled on top with a cross (x) and on the south face with: U.S. L. M. No. 1602, letters 1/2 ins. long, and set 1/8 inch deep. The center of cross in Basalt stone, is directly over the center of the cross, chiseled in bedrock, underneath said Basalt stone, and to the North of said stone so marked I build a conical mound of stone, 6 ft. across the base and 5 ft. high.

The hill selected for this U.S. L. Mon. is in a spur of the so called Union Pass range, about 3 miles in a westerly direction from where the old Beal road crosses said main range, about 14 miles east of the town of Needles on the Colorado river.



This diagram is to give locator a general idea of plan of location under the new law. The Discovery Shaft can be in the center of claim or any distance from either end desired. In the diagram it is placed 500 feet from one end and 1000 feet from the other. Commence description of claim at a center end monument, giving its distance and direction from center of Discovery Shaft; thence bound the claim in either direction. In description be careful to state locality of claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify the claim.
