U. S. L. M. No. 1679 is a pine post 8 ft. long, 6 ins. square, set in mound of stones 8 ft. base, 5 ft. high; and mound filled with small stones and gravel, solidly packed. The north side of post scribed U. S. L. M. No. 1679.

Drove a nail in top of post and nailed a 2" \times 4" scantling, 16 ft. long, on side of post, with red and white flag on top of scantling.
