## Notice of Mining Location. QuartZ.Claim.



To all whom it may concern:

This mining claim, the name of which is the Warren Boy mining claim situate on lands belonging to the United Sates of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by John Graham, Thomas Young and J.B. 
