Be it Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Arizona:

SECTION 1. Every notice of location of a mining claim shall contain: First, the name of the claim located; second, the name of the locator; third, the date of location; fourth, the number of feet in length of said claim and the number of feet claimed on each side of the center of the discovery shaft, lengthwise of the claim; lifth, the general course of the lode deposit of premises located; sixth, the locality of the claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify

Sec. 2. All mining locations hereafter located, the certificate of location of which shall not contain: First, the name of the lode, or premises; second, the name of the locator, or locators; third, the date of location; fourth, the number of feet in length of said claim and the number of feet claimed on each side of the center of the discovery shalt, lengthwise of the claim; fifth, the general course of the lode, or premises, as near as may be; sixth, the locality of the claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify the claim, shall be void.

Sec. 3.
