

The exterior boundaries commence at this monument on the vein at the North end of the claim; running thence in a westerly direction at right angle with the vein, 300 feet to a monument; thence Southerly parallel with the vein 1500 feet to a monument; thence Easterly at right angle with the vein 600 feet to a monument; thence northerly parallel with the vein 1500 feet to a monument; thence Westerly at a right angle with the vein 300 feet to the place of beginning.


