This memorandum cancels the survey of the Main Point and Nevada lode claims of Mineral Survey No. 1777. By Decision of the Hearing Examiner dated April 20, 1967, Contest No. AR-021164-I-1-4, the Nevada lode claim was declared null and void. No appeal from the decision was filed, and by Decision dated June 26, 1967, the Land Office Manager declared the case closed.


