Subject: Mineral Survey No. 1777

This memorandum cancels the survey of the Main Point and Nevada lode claims of Mineral Survey No. 1777. A notation should be made on the plat of M.S. #1777 that the survey of the Main Point and Nevada lodes has been canceled by State Director's memorandum dated April 19, 1968. The plat and field notes should remain in the files. The attached field notes should be made a part of the original notes.

A notation of the cancellation of the survey of these two lode claims should also be made on the Mineral Mining District Sheets located in the Land Office.

By Relinquishment of Mining Claim form dated July 10, 1967, Grant Van Tilborg and Martha Van Tilborg relinquished all their right, title and interest in and to the Main Point lode claim.

By Decision of the Hearing Examiner dated April 20, 1967, Contest No. AR-021164-I-1-4, the Nevada lode claim was declared null and void. No appeal from the decision was filed, and by Decision dated June 26, 1967, the Land Office Manager declared the case closed.
