- a. The soil of the Old Pennsylvania placer claim, which is situated in section 25, T. 19 S., R. 15 E., (unsurveyed,) and is within the Santa Rita Forest Reserve, is composed of coarse gravel and sand.

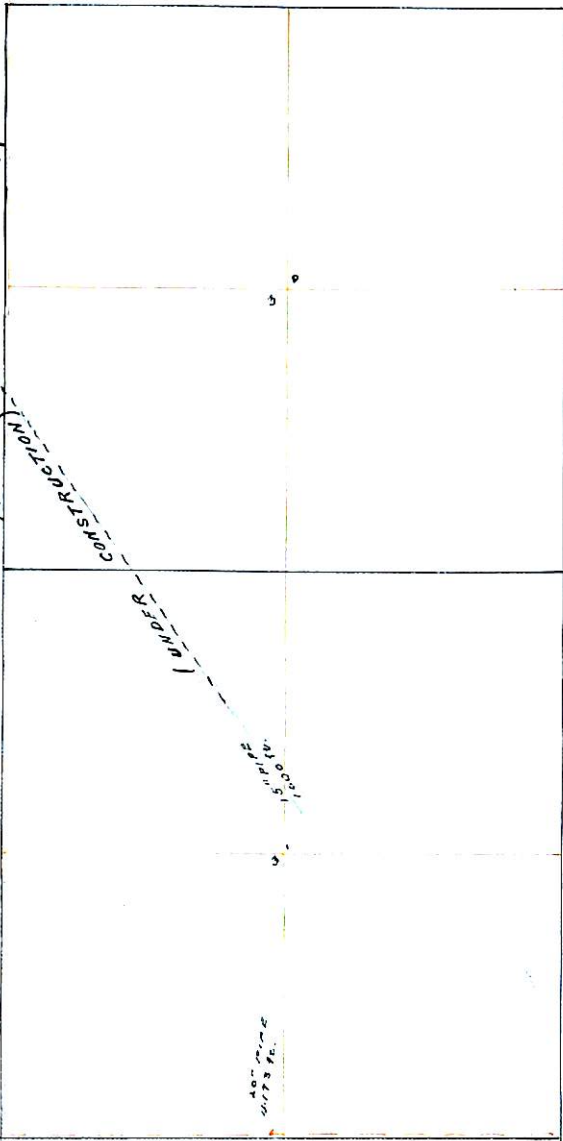

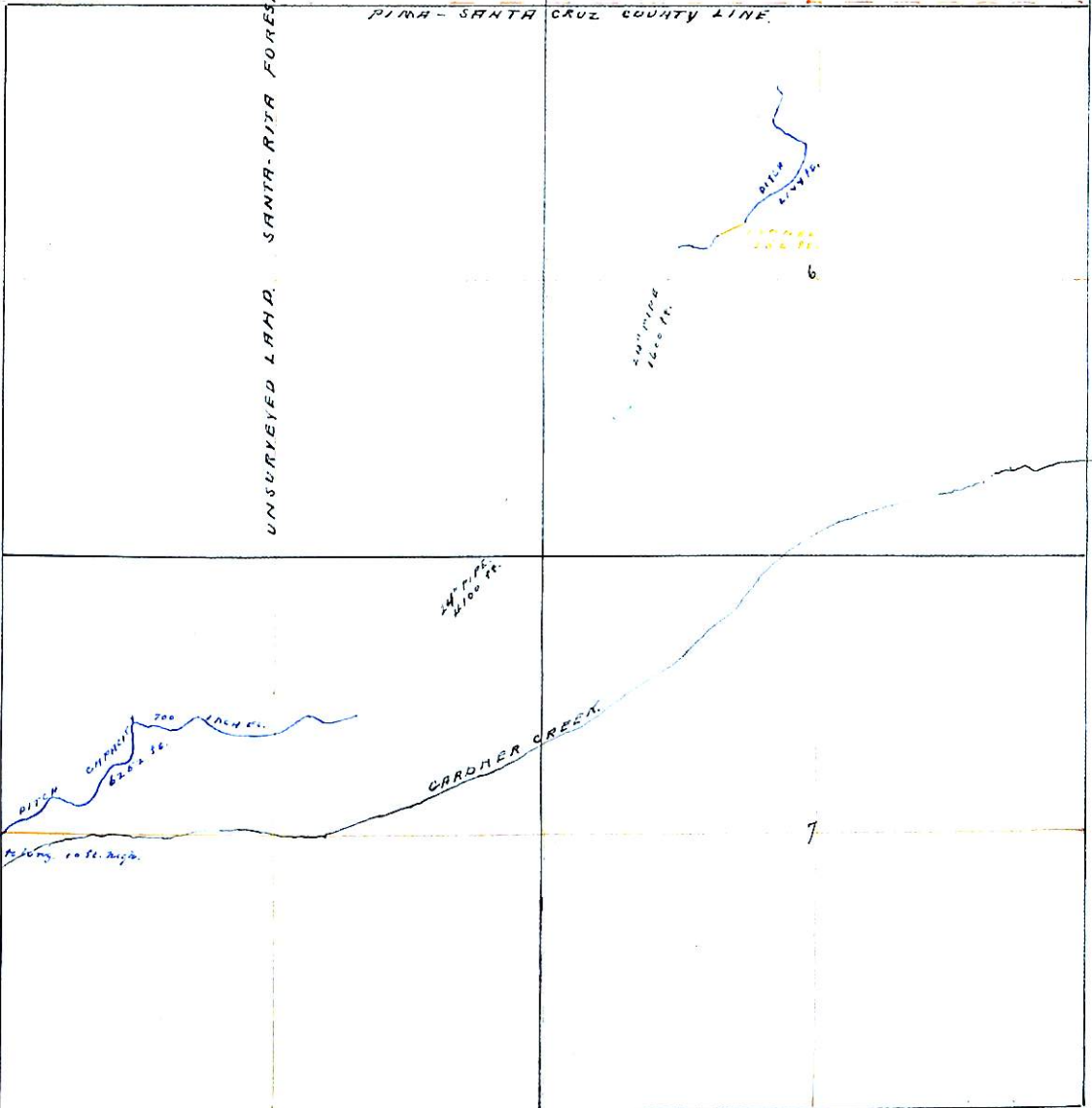
LINE OF RESERVE.
