I hereby certify that the improvements made upon and for the benefit of the Old Pennsylvania Placer, Mineral Survey No.1791, exceeded Five hundred(\$500.00) dollars in value at the time of survey, and that the improvements consist of discovery shaft, 4 x 6 x 5 ft., value, Thirty (\$30.00) dollars, and a four thousand, feur-hundred (\$4000.00) dollars interest in a pipe line, described as follows:




