Notice of Location of the Lizzie Lee, Mining Claim.

Under and in accordance with the provisions of an "Act of Congress" of the United States of America, approved May, 10, 1872, and amendments thereto, the undersigned claim for Mining purposes Six hundred feet in width and Fifteen Hundred feet in length along this vein or lode, called the Lizzie Lee, Mine and situate in Humbug Mining District, Yavapai County Territory of Arizona.

Said Mine or Mineral Claim is described and bounded as follows to wit;--

Running along ~~the~~ ledge or vein from the monument in which this notice (duplicate) is placed 200 feet Easterly and 1300 feet Westerly.

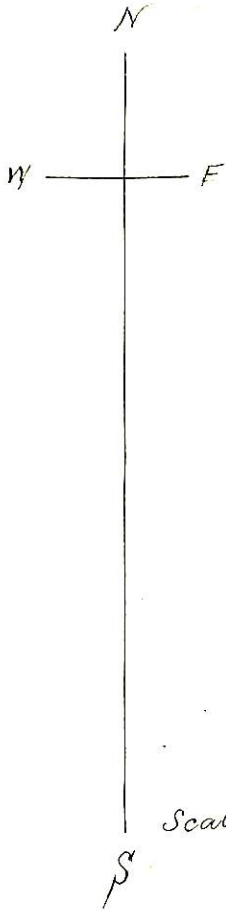
