

ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S.M.M.NO.1872.

Field notes of the establishment of U. S. M. M. No. 1872 on Cochise Hill, so-called, south of Bisbee, Arizona, in the Warren Mining District:

I find upon examination of the location of the Martin and nine other claims which I received instructions to survey under date of December 2, 1903, and Survey No. 1872, that said claims cover Cochise Hill so-called at the southern extremity of the Mule Mountains in the Warren Mining District, more than the prescribed distance of two miles from any monument of the public or international surveys, or any established U. S. location monuments. The highest sharp point of Cochise Hill from which the surrounding country can be commanded for a great distance was selected for the site of U. S. M. M. No. 1872.

A hole was drilled in the rock and a square headed iron bolt bearing a cross in the center of the head was inserted and cemented in place.
