To All Whom It May Concern: Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter VI. of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and regulations have this day located fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet of this vein or lode, bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, with surface ground three hundred (300) feet on each side of the center of vein, with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of the United States mining laws, under which it is located. 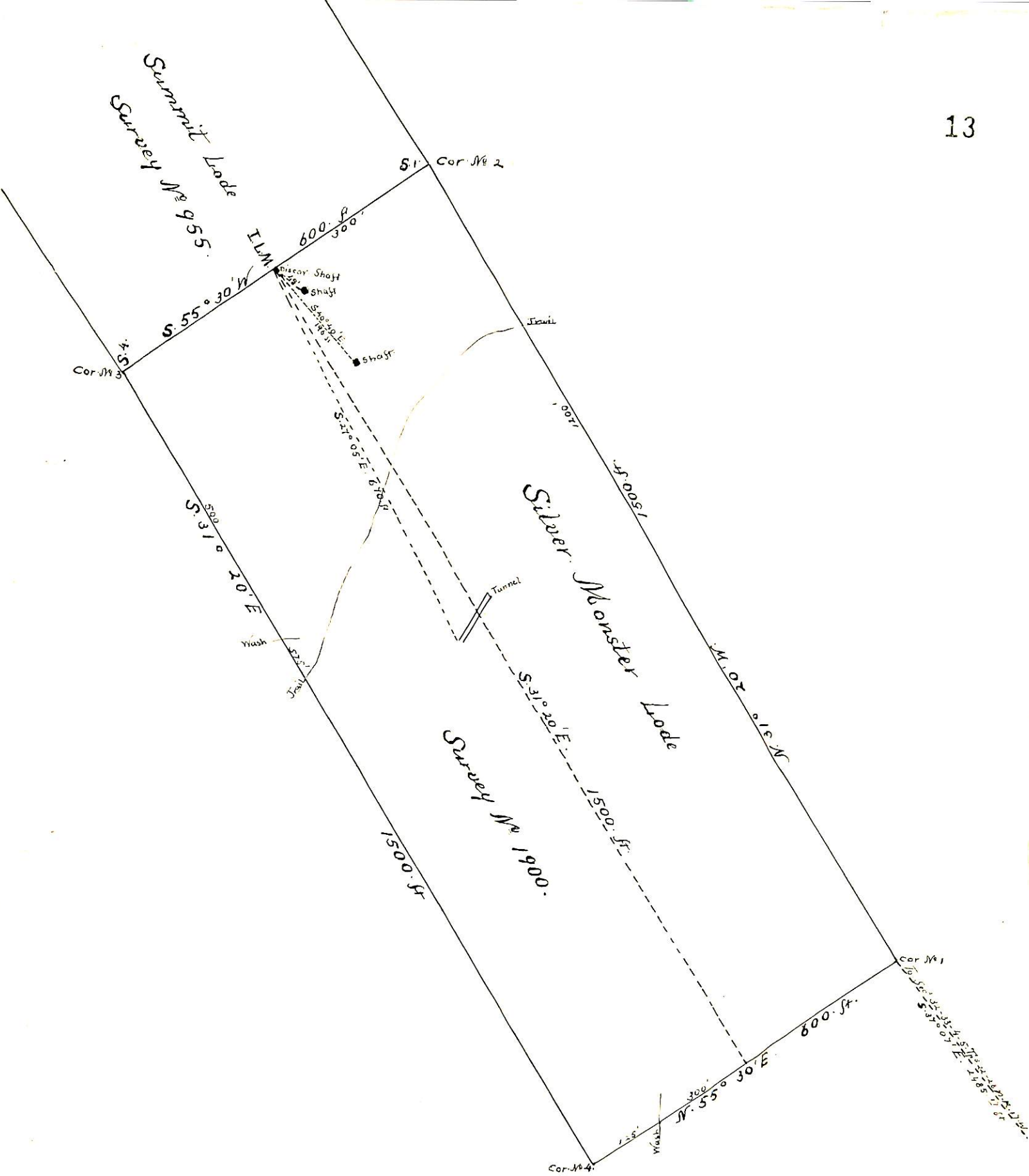
