To all whom it may concern; This mining claim, the name of which is the "Monroe" Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Geo.P.Harrington, the undersigned, on the 1st day of August, 1903.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and I claim 300 feet in a southerly direction and 1200 feet in a northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South. The claim is situated and located in the Tiger Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one mile in a North Westerly direction from Ora Bella Mill and joins the North end of the Champion lode.

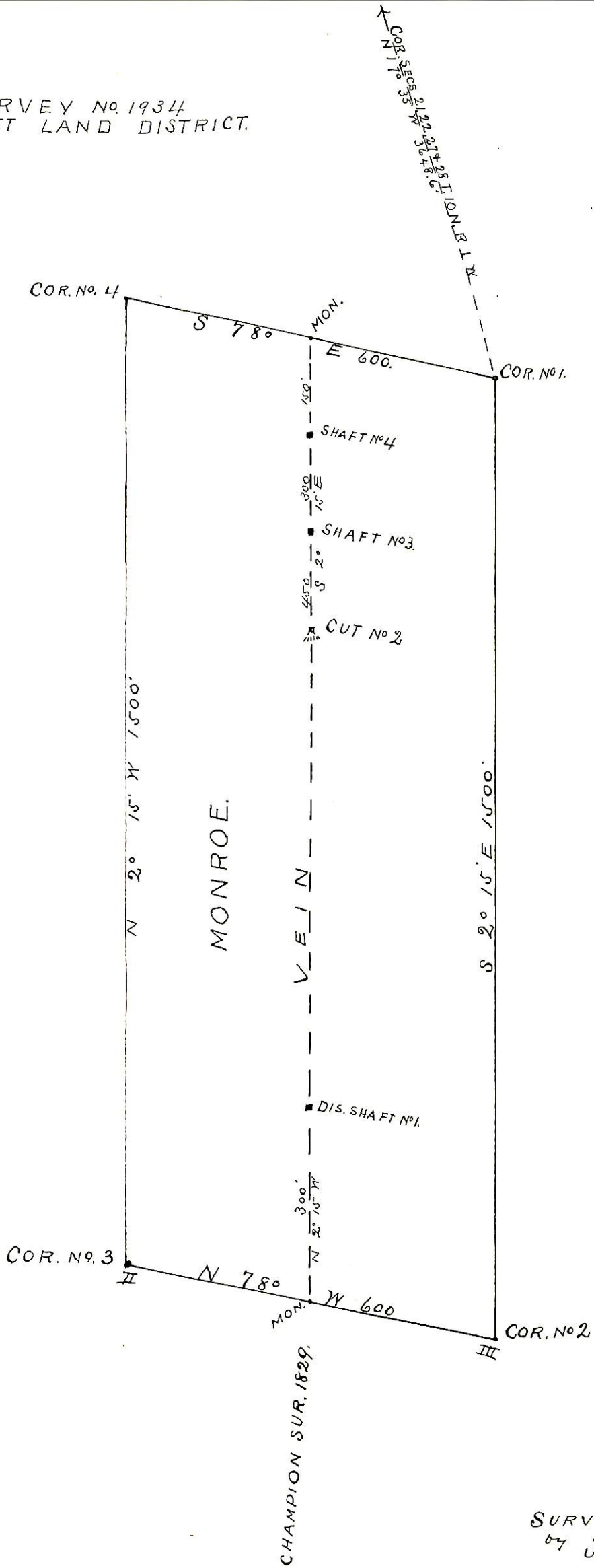

Also effective November 28, 1994, the suspension is lifted on the plat approved June 23, 1933, and accepted January 6, 1934, T. 5 N., R. 10 W.

*Portions of T. 5 N., R. 10 W., were resurveyed in 1933 under Group 183 and in 1940-42 under Group 235 for the primary purpose of preserving the identification of the Boundary of Canyon De Chelly National Monument. The portions of those surveys resurveyed in 1991-92 under Group 715, plat accepted August 16, 1994, and the subdivision of sections 10, 22, 25 and 26 in the 1940-42 resurvey are the only portions of the Navajo Special Meridian that remain uncanceled.

This cancellation is to include the 1869 survey of the South and West Boundaries, by Treaty of June 1, 1868, and the subsequent 1919-20 resurvey of the West Boundary of the Navajo Indian Reservation.
