The surface embraced by the Buckeye Lode and the Sharpshooter Lode is quite steep both to the north and to the south of King Canyon.

Cor. No.I Sharpshooter Lode is 5600 ft. above aea level as determined by Barometer reading, the surface decending quite rapidly to Cor. 2-I, elevation 5075.

Crossing King Canyon the surface ascends to an elevation of 5450 at Cor. 4 Buckeye.

Cor. 3 Buckeye is 30 ft higher than Cor. 4. From Cor. 3 the surface decends to the bottom of King Canyon, 30 feet lower than Cor. 2-3 then ascends to an elevation of 5500 at Cor 4 Sharpshooter, ascending 100 feet to Cor. I Sharpshooter.


