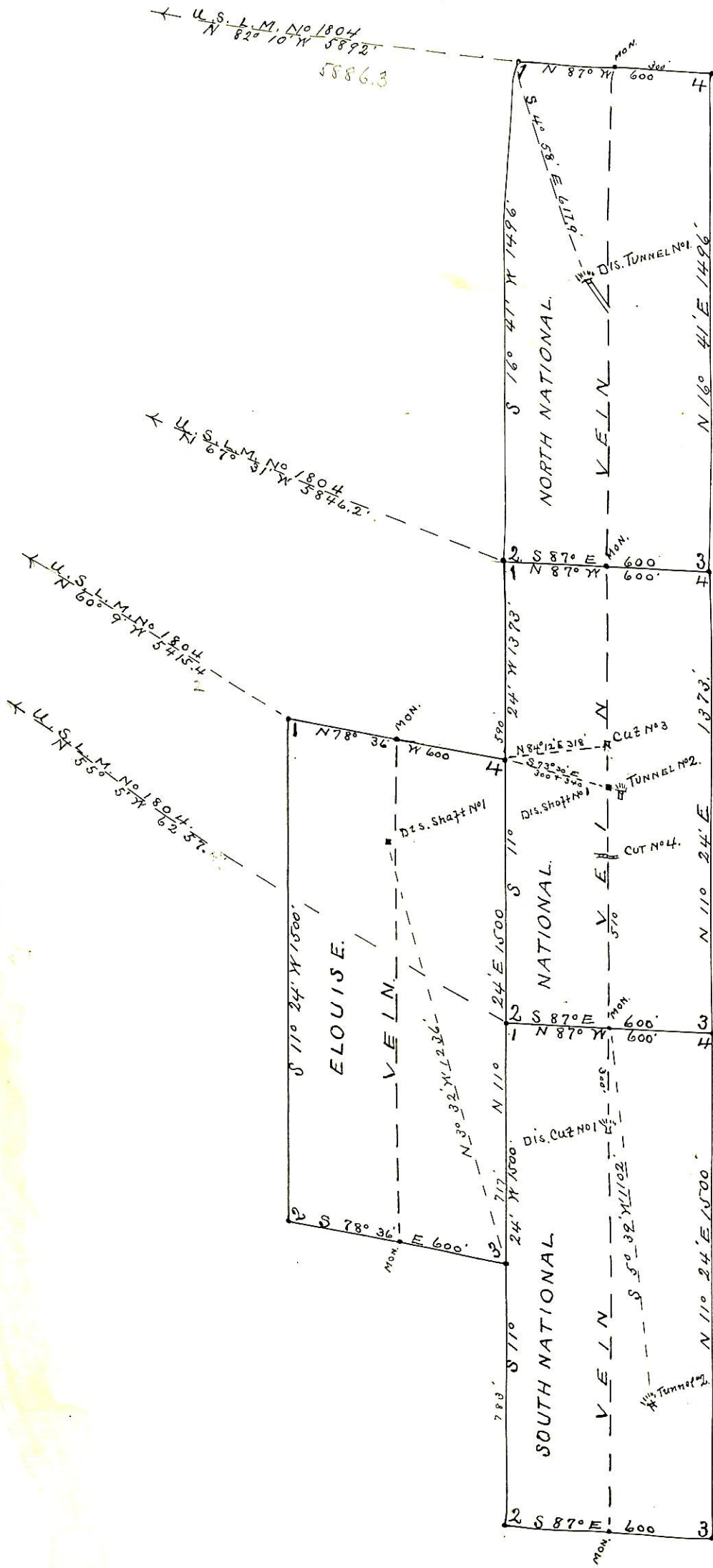

The portions of those surveys resurveyed in 1991-92 under Group 715, plat accepted August 16, 1994, and the subdivision of sections 10, 22, 25 and 26 in the 1940-42 resurvey are the only portions of the Navajo Special Meridian that remain uncanceled.
