That the valuable ore thich is found in paying quantities and can be worked at a product in found in this district and throughout the investate neighborhood of the mining claims embraced in this entry always occurs at great depth; that the rich and valueble ore seldon appears on the surface and that there are very fer large and well defined lodes or leads on the surface such as are found in some other copper districts where there are well defined contact voing, and that the rich and valuable ore does not ordinarily appear in ledges and veins discernable on the surface, such as are found in connection with gold mines and gold bearing ledges.

in doing the work on the claims embraced in this entry the greater port of it was done near the North-western end of the group for the purpose of emploring as for as possible certain dikes of coarse grained basalt discovered in three or four voints on the Her York and Lone Than elaims, and also to prospect a silicious heavily iron strined propping from thirty to fifty feet in milth, extending in a south-easterly direction from maft No. 6 of the Lone Stor Lode lowerd the Hobow Lode. At the point where the shaft was sunt the jasperoid material of out-grap carried a small amount of copper in the form of melachite in the cracks of the rock. At a depth of about six feet this highly silicious capping was penetrated and for the next for feet the rock was a bally grushed chale; beneath this was limestone showing precciation and cementation by calcite; occesionally small pieces of calcacte or confur clance appear in this rook. This fracturing is delieved to be along a shear zone extending in a general South-easterly direction toward the Hobb Lode but of which no sign appears on the surface of the dobo Lode, part of which is masked by conglomerate of an age later than the ore bearing limestones. Thile there is no such continuous out-oron so as to constitute a vein or lead, this small faulting zone is worth exploration, and the prospector orming all the claims of this group and bent on doing his developing vork for the Hobo Lode to the best advantage, and knowing the manner in which ore occurs in the Warren Mining District, would naturally expend his labore at the point where the more rea done on the Lone star Lode, and in following the dikes of the intrusive rock in the vicinity, thus tend to develop the geological formation of the claims and the indications of the mineral found in the development work of the Warren Mining District. It is not even expected that this shallow surface work will disclose ore bodies. With the exception of the original workings of the copper queen wining

depth of from five hundred to eleven hundred feet. These shear gones and dikes may be important features in determining the cituation of the ore bodies and on them the development rock is best expended for the exploration of the geological conditions so that a proper location may be found for a deep weeking short on the group.

The presumed course voin marked on the Mobo Lode to comply with the regulations does not trace the actual course
of the lode. The known copper one deposits of the Warran
liming Cistrict in no case exist in the form of lodes or
veins. The deposits are irregular, rudely tabular masses
found without defined walls. Furthermore they do not out-crop.

Ording to the fact that there are few well declined loder and vedua of copper or a specifical the autrece, a large portion of the warren wining District, although known to contain some copper in small low grade vedua, until recently resained undeveloped; that the marked showing as the same appears throughout this portion of the district is not sufficient to varient or sutherize the rinking of a shaft of the necessary distil to develop and prove the value of each claim and sinking one shaft which will develop a number of claims in better precise. This is due to the fact that valueble are lies at such great aspth that one claim in seldom of the sufficient value to pay for the sinking of the necessary chaft then it is not definitely known that the one will be of sufficient richness at great depth to pay for the rock involved.

The present acknowledged system for the proper development in this district and a system that has made the development of this district a possibility of late years is to thoroughly and carefully prospect a section of ground embracing anywhere from five to thirty claims and efter

prospecting the same to sink the necessary shafts and do
the surress work necessary to make a careful goological
study of the formations found and to then nelect that point
which good mining experience would indicate as the more
siventageous and from their point sink a deep shaft and from
the bottom of the shaft run various drifts into the surrounding country and from these drifts winges and raises as
mining judgment dictates. Affiant nurther states that in his


