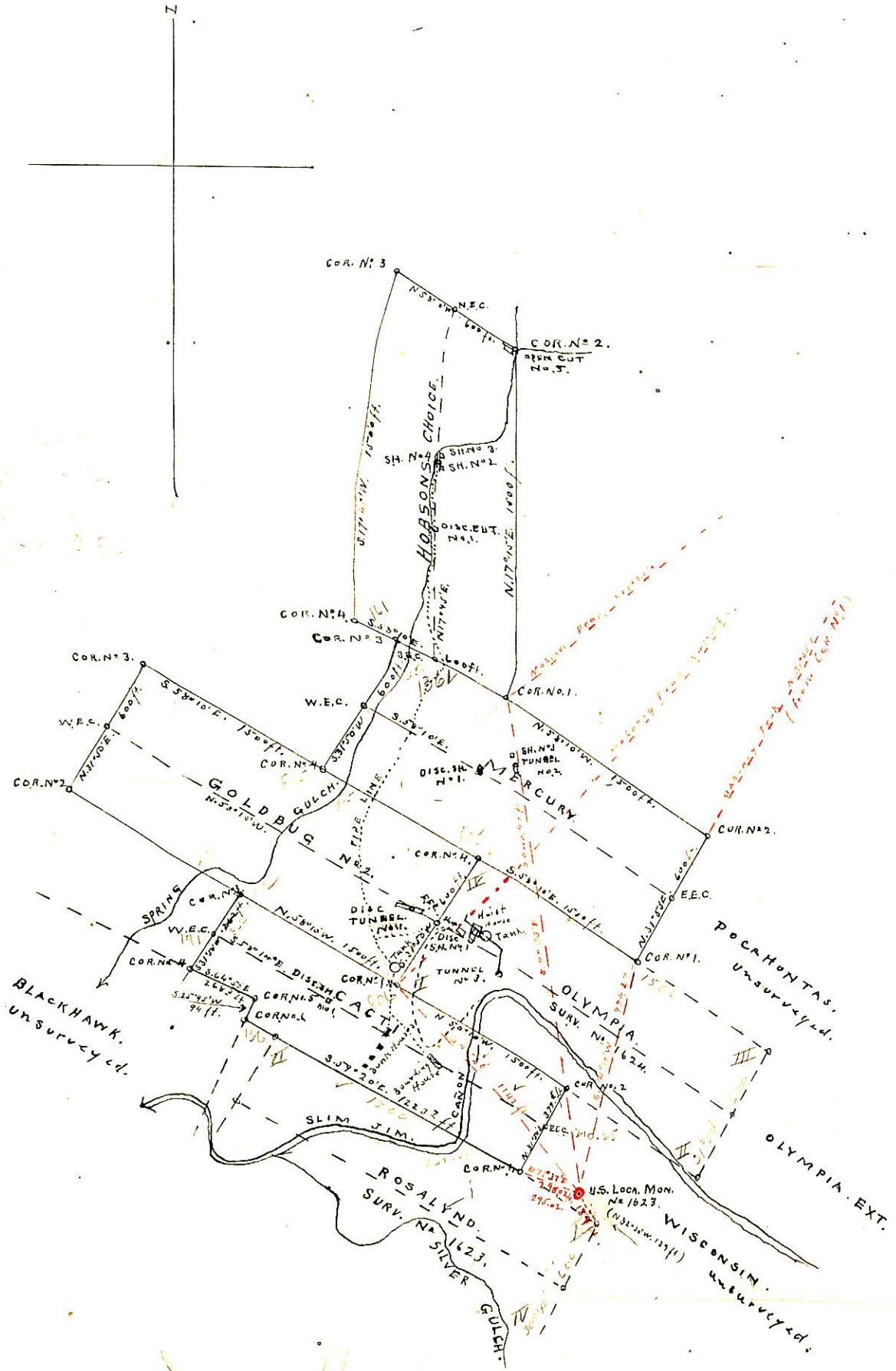
PRESCOTT LAND DISTRICT.
