This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian determined by direct solar observations and checked by a Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 100 ft. steel tape.

### Polaris Observation

August 20<sup>th</sup> 1904: At Cor. No 1 Lady Mary lode and at 9<sup>h</sup> 34<sup>m</sup> l. m. t. I observed Polaris at eastern elongation and marked the line with an iron bolt at a point 300 ft. North of corner.

August 21<sup>st</sup> 1904, at 6<sup>h</sup> 15<sup>m</sup> l. m. t. I deflected  $1^{\circ}26'$  to the West and marked the meridian thus determined by an iron rod driven in the ground. From this meridian I tested my courses determined by solar observations, which I found to agree within 1 minute.

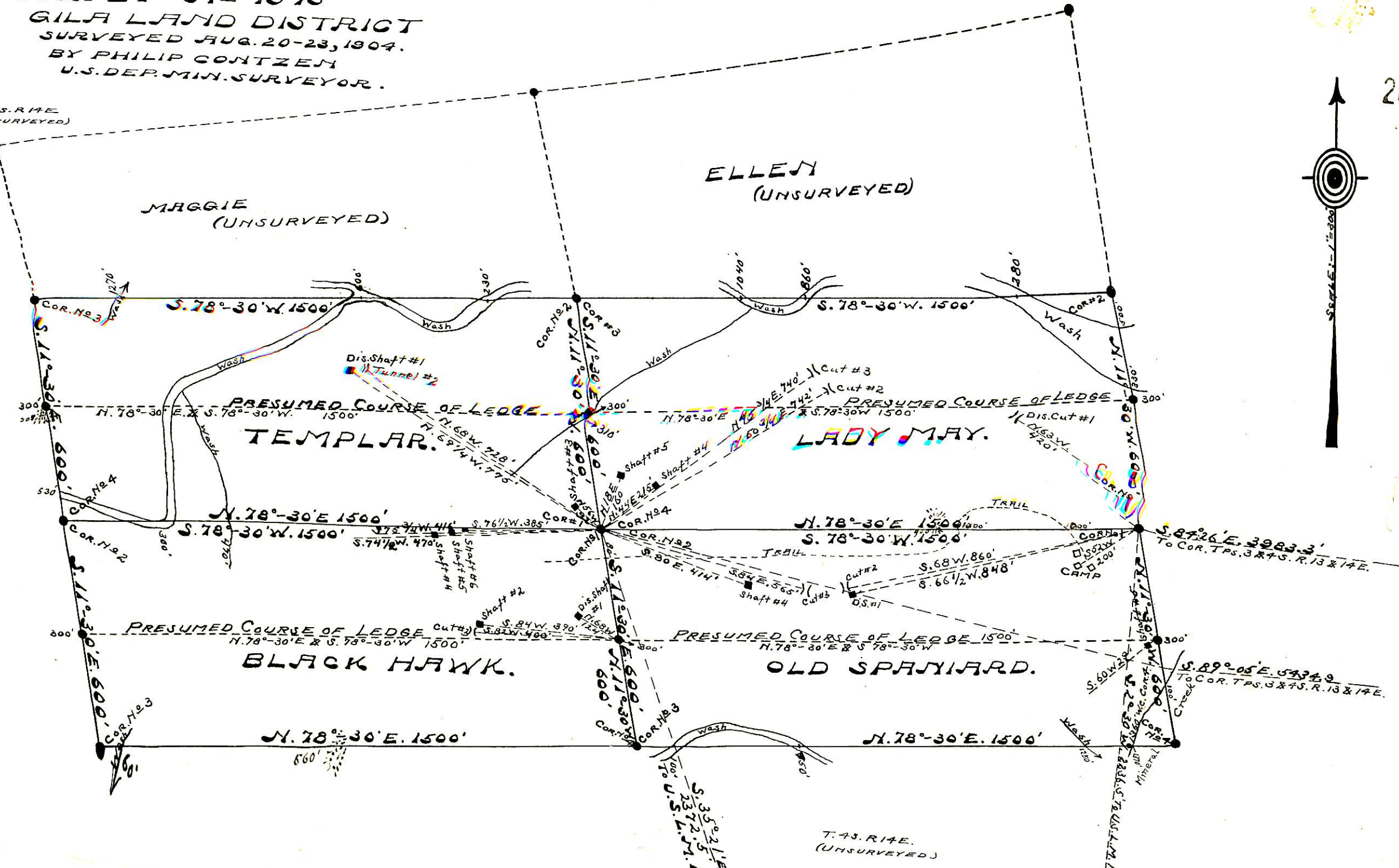
