The reading of the needle on this meridian gave the Variation $N. 13^{\circ} 56'$ East, at 7 o'clock A.M.

The Preliminary matter, Final affidavits, and Affidavit of \$500. improvements were taken before a justice of the Peace because there was no Notary within 40 miles of the location and therefore could not be reached without great delay and expense, and I am informed that the Statutes of this Territory provide for justice of the Peace performing this function.


