TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:-

WHEREAS, heretofore and on the first day of January, 1899, William H. Goode, Mrs Francis H. Parko and A.S. Henderson, did enter upon and locate the Golden Gate Mining Claim, in Marshaw Mining District, Santa Cruz County, Arizona Territory; and,

WHEREAS, they did, upon making said location, erect monuments of stone on the ground so that the boundaries could be readily traced, to-wit: nine monuments in all, as follows: one in the center of said claim at the discovery shaft thereof upon which the notice of location was posted; one at the center of each end of said claim; one at each corner of said claim, and one at the center of each side line of said claim; and,
