AMENDED NOTICE OF LOCATION.

WHEREAS, heretofore and on the first day of January, 1899, William H. Goode, Mrs Francis H. Parke and A.S. Henderson, did enter upon and locate the Golden Gate Mining Claim, in Harshaw Mining District, Santa Cruz County, Arizona Territory; and,

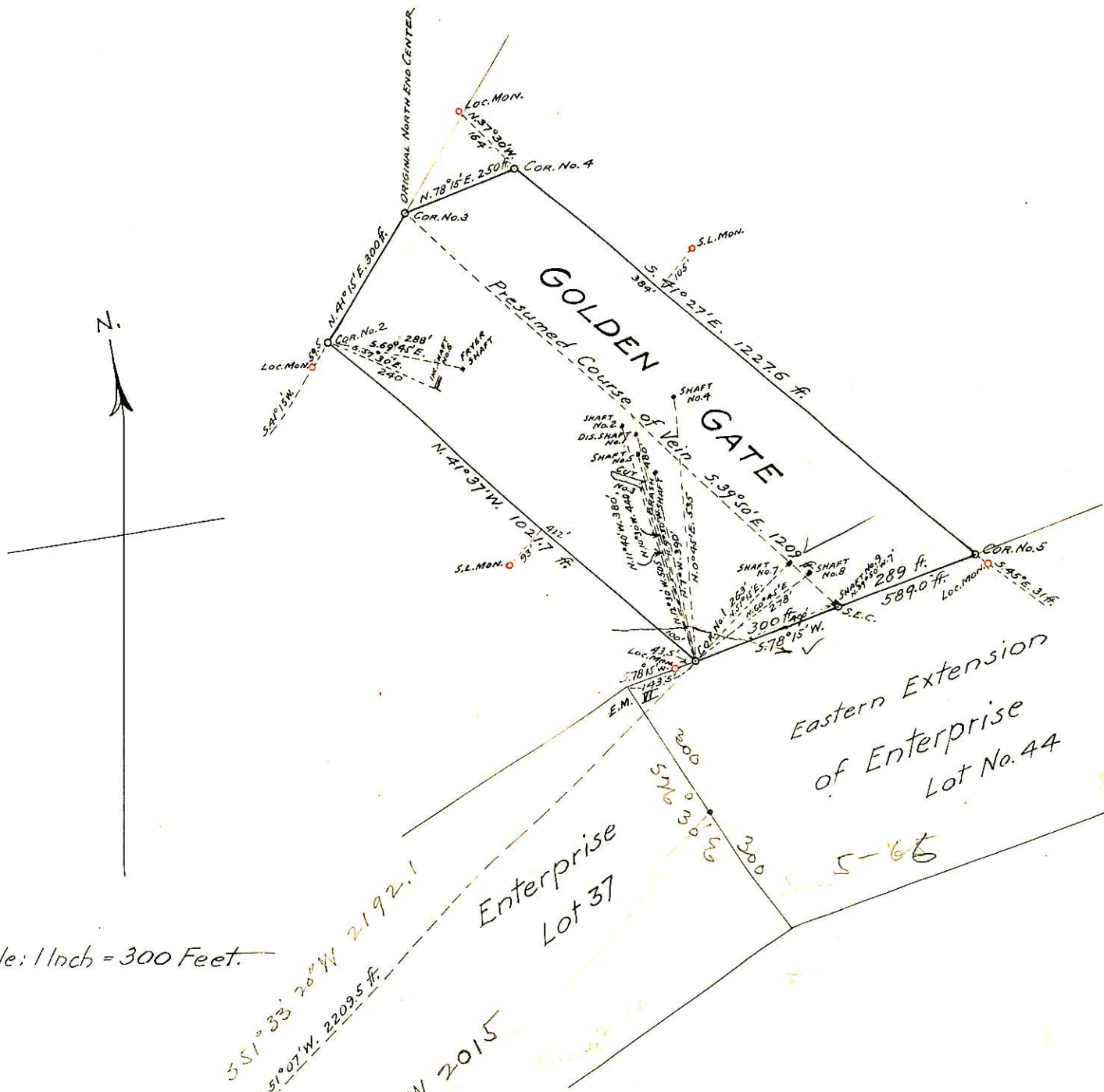
