Instrument

This survey was made with a Young and Sons light mountain transit with a Smith's Solar attachment. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations and checked by a Polaris observation. The distances were measured with 50 ft and 100 ft. steel tapes.

Polaris Observation

At corner H. 01 February 28th at 8^h 39^m
P.M. m.t., I observed Polaris at western elongation and marked the line at a point 250 ft. N. of line, by an iron rod.

March 1st, at 7^h 15^m A.M. l.m.t., I deflected $1^{\circ}26'$ from the line marked on the ground to the east.

From the meridian thus established I checked lines ascertained by solar observations, which agreed within a minute.

Note: The disagreement between
the bearing of the side line of
the Belmont Lot Lot 38 A.
and the one returned by me.
is due to errors in the old
survey.


