
NOTICE OF CANCELLATION OF MINERAL SURVEY

AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.
Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Memphis Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by H. C. Krueger, a citizen of the U. S., the grantor of the undersigned, on the 7th day of January 1898.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred (1500) feet, and I claim three hundred (300) feet in a Northerly direction and twelve hundred (1200) feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred (300) feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the northerly to the southerly.

The claim is situated and located in the Black Hills Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 1-3/4 miles in a southerly direction from Johnny Webb's cabin on Grape Vine and about 3 miles east of Agua Fria and lies north of the Northern Giant lode and south of the Kansas lode.
