INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Complete Engineers Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a polaris observation.

The distances were measured with a 100 foot steel tape.

Note 1:-

The calculated course from Cor. No.1, of this survey, using the tie to Cor. No.1, of the Bilk claim, survey No. 462, is N. 25° 46' E. 1394 feet distance.

By actual measurement on the ground, U. S. L. M. No. 3, Pioneer District brs. N. 27° 08' E. 1375. ft. The tie of the Bilk claim, survey No. 462 to the U. S. L. M. No. 3, is in error.

Note 2:-

For U. S. L. M. No. 3, Pioneer District, I found a pine post 7 inches in diameter, squared to 5 ins. scribed U. S. M. M. No. III in small mound of stone. The post had rotted off at the ground, the monument surrounding it was not over 1 ft. high, so I re-established this by setting a porphyry stone, 12 X 12 X 34 ins. set 2 ft. in ground, with mound of stone alongside. 6 ft. base, 4 ft. high, chiseled U. S. L. M. No. 3, and set the old post in ground at side of stone to identify old monument.

This U. S. L. M. Pioneer District, is located on a hog-back ridge, a spur from the main range, and is between the East and West branches of Silver King Creek, to the West of the old Stillman grade trail, whence brs.

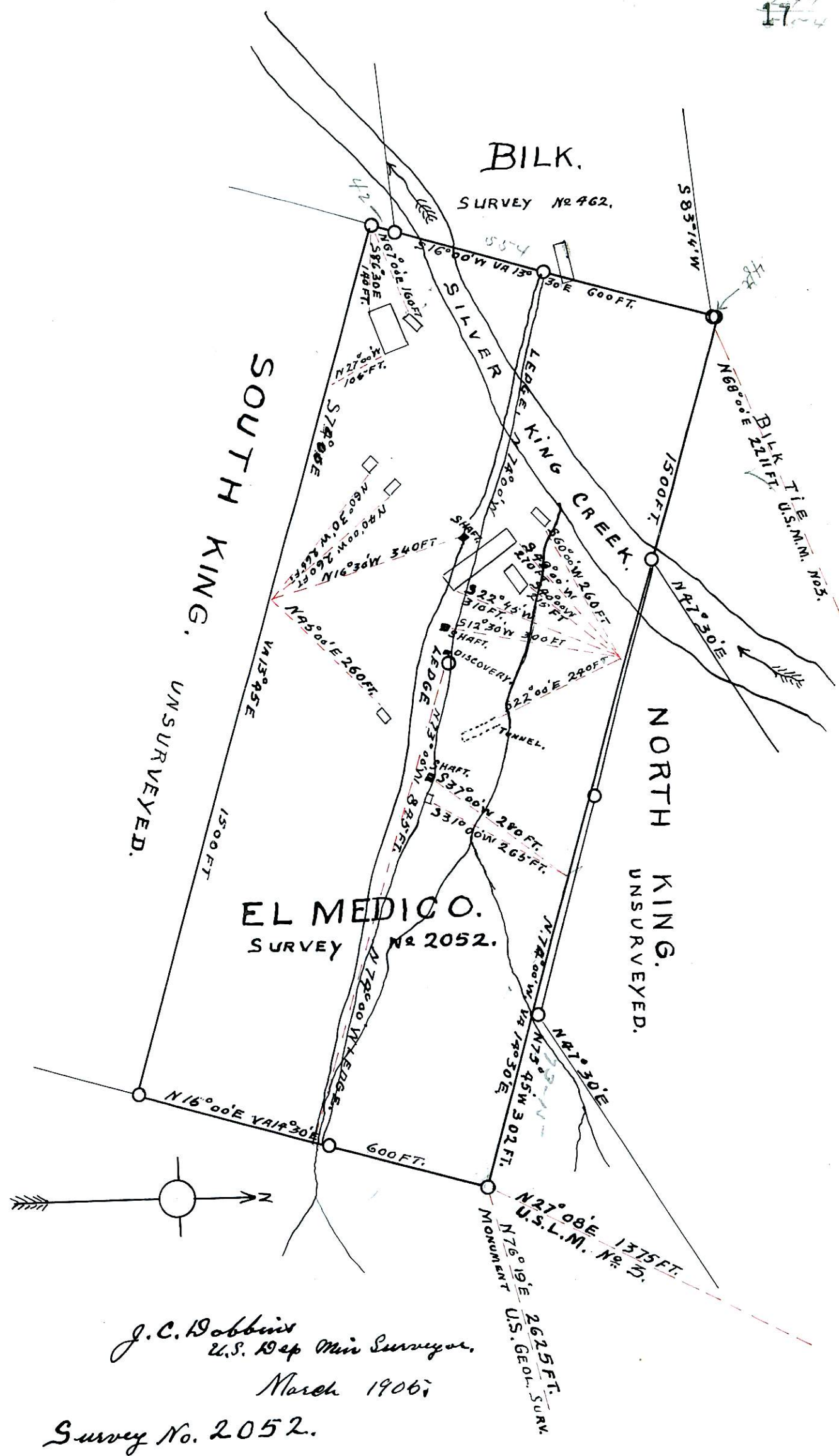
