Instrument.

This survey was made with a Stackpole and Bros. Transit NO. 1269. The course was deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct observation checked by an observation on Polaris.

The measurements were made with a 100 ft. and a 300 ft. steel tape.

At midnight L.M.T. of July 11th. 1905, I set transit over point and observe Polaris, following it to its eastern elongation. I set point on this line and at daylight turn an angle of  $1^{\circ}26'30''$  left for true meridian. By transit line with angles I connect this line with point on centre line of Cinnabar NO. I. Lode and check solar observation which I find to be correct.

Note:-The Company purposes to work the ore of this property from their main shaft, the discovery shaft of Cinnabar NO. I. 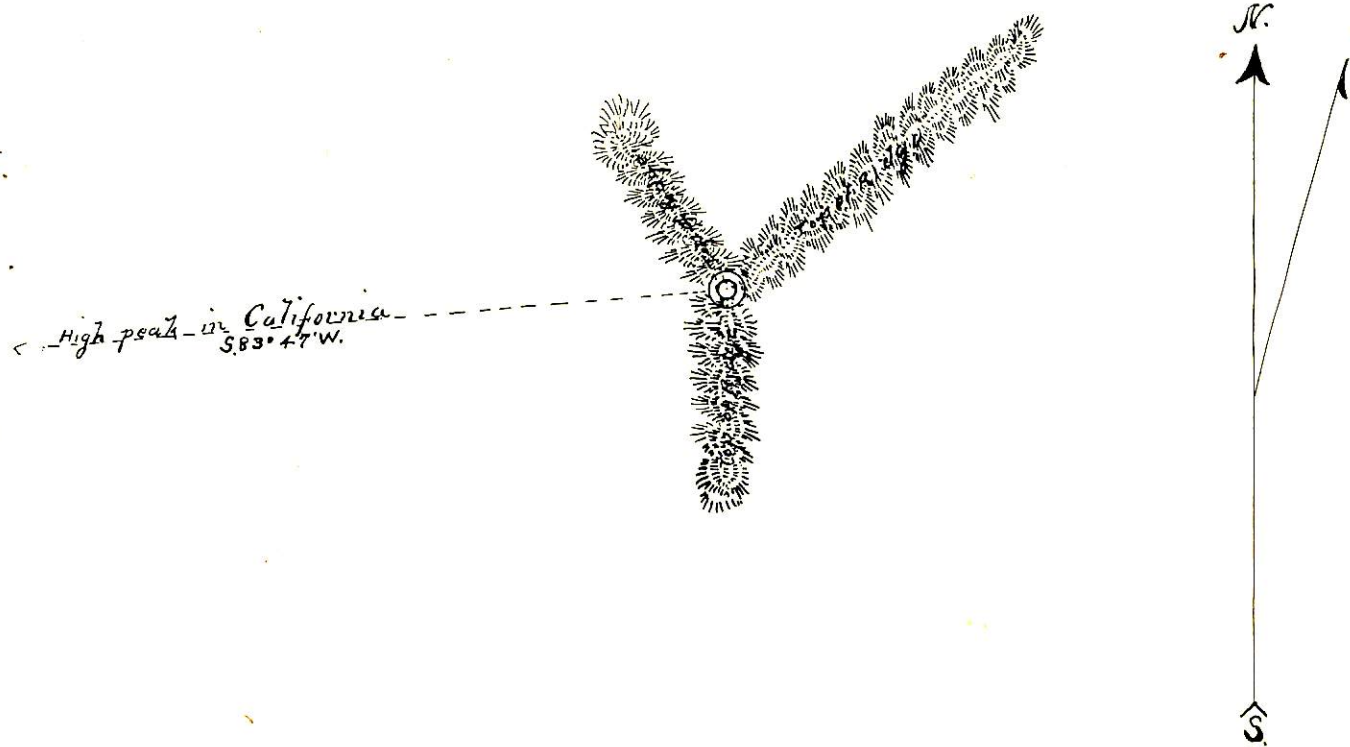

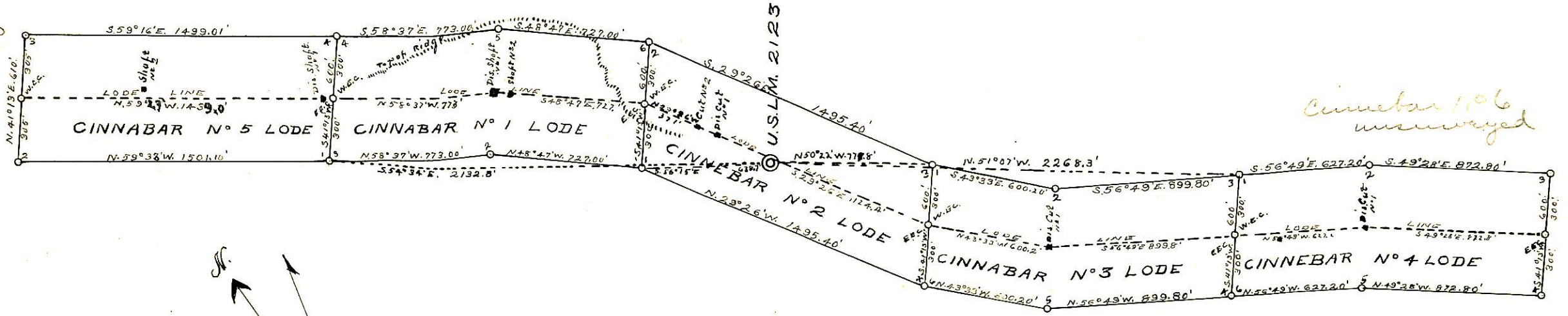




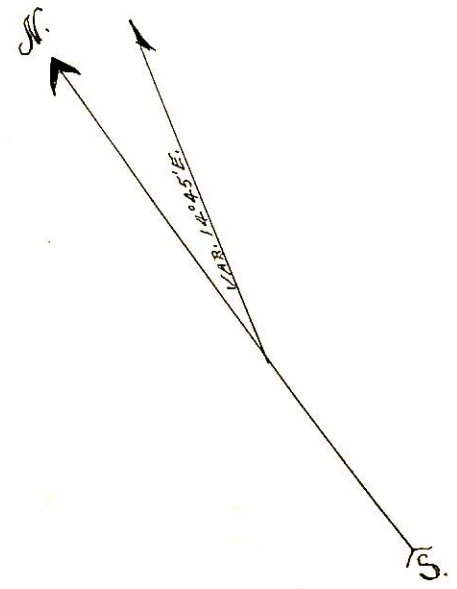
# SURVEY 2123.

AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION LODE CLAIM.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:
