AMENDED LOCATION NOTICE OF THE COPPER CZAR MINING CLAIM.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That I, Loyal A. Osborne, a citizen of the United States over the age of twenty-one (21) years, and residing in the City of Pittsburg, in the State of Pennsylvania, do hereby make and file this my amended location notice of the Copper Czar lode mining claim, situate in Agua Fria mining District, County of Yavapai, Territory of Arizona, situate on public unsurveyed lands of the United States, and in which there is valuable mineral deposits. That I claim Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet in length on said lode, Six Hundred Forty (640) feet in a Northerly direction and Eight Hundred Sixty (860) feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with Three Hundred (300) feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said vein or lode.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Northerly to the Southerly. 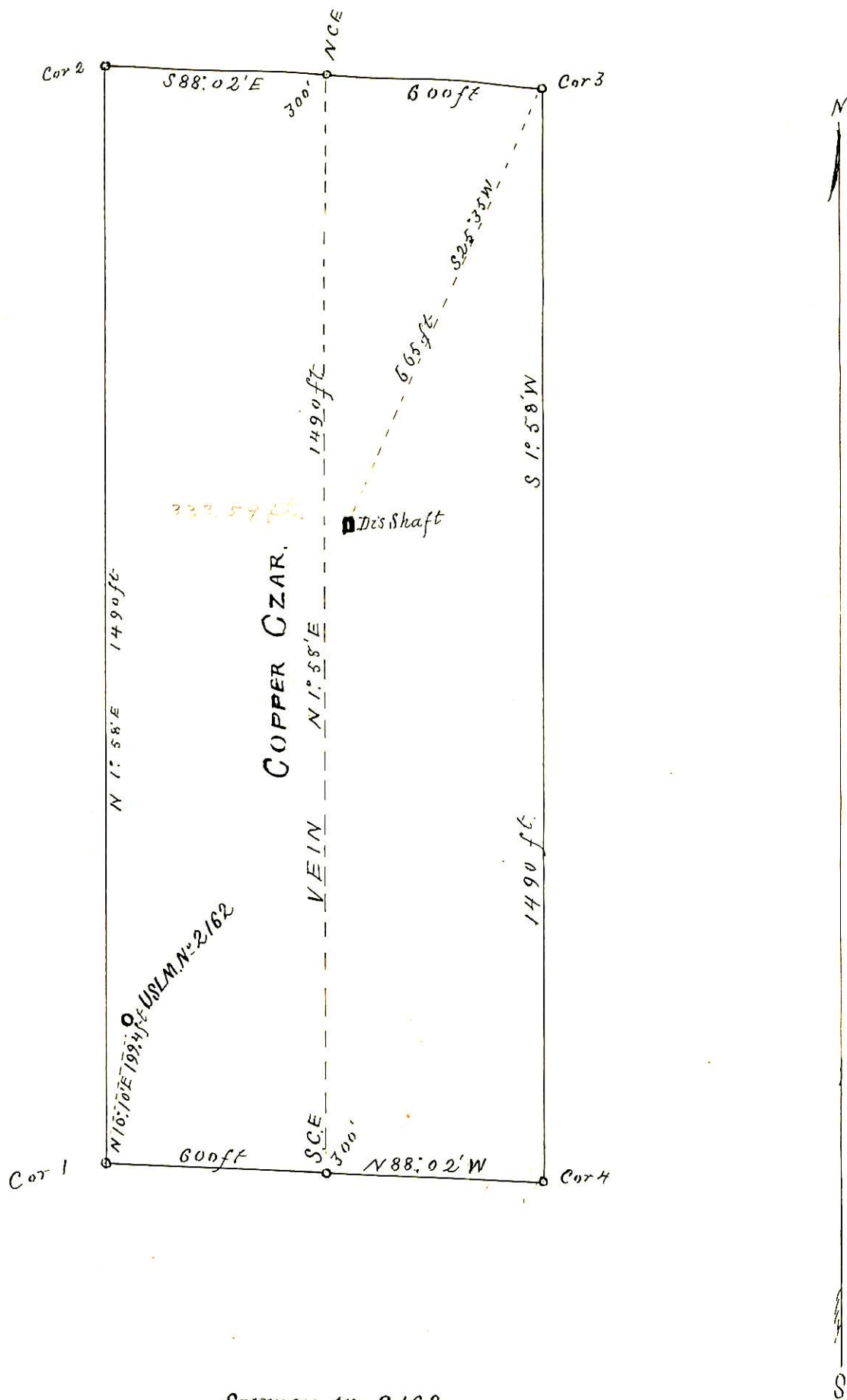
