AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.
Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Mountain View Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by Chas. H. Hooker, a citizen of the United States the undersigned, on the 17th day of May 1906.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred feet, and I claim twelve hundred feet in a westerly direction and three hundred feet in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Northeast to the Southwest.


