NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.  
Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Water Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by L. T. Bryan a citizen of the United States the undersigned, on the 30th day of Jan. 1903.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 1000 feet in a Easteerly direction and 500 feet in a Westeerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the East to the West.

The claim is situated and located in the Peck Mining District in Yavapia County, in the Territory of Arizona, about a mile in a Southerly direction from the Black Warrior Mine, and is in what is known as Muldoon Gulsh.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at a monument of stone at a point in a Easteerly direction 1000 feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the East end line of said claim; thence 300 feet to a monument of stone being the Northeast corner of said claim; thence 1500 feet to a monument of stone being at the Northwest corner of said claim; thence 300 feet to a monument of stone at the center of the west end of said claim; thence 300 feet to a monument of stone being at the Southwest corner of said claim; thence 1500 feet to a monument of stone at the Southeast corner of said claim; thence 300 feet to the place of beginning.

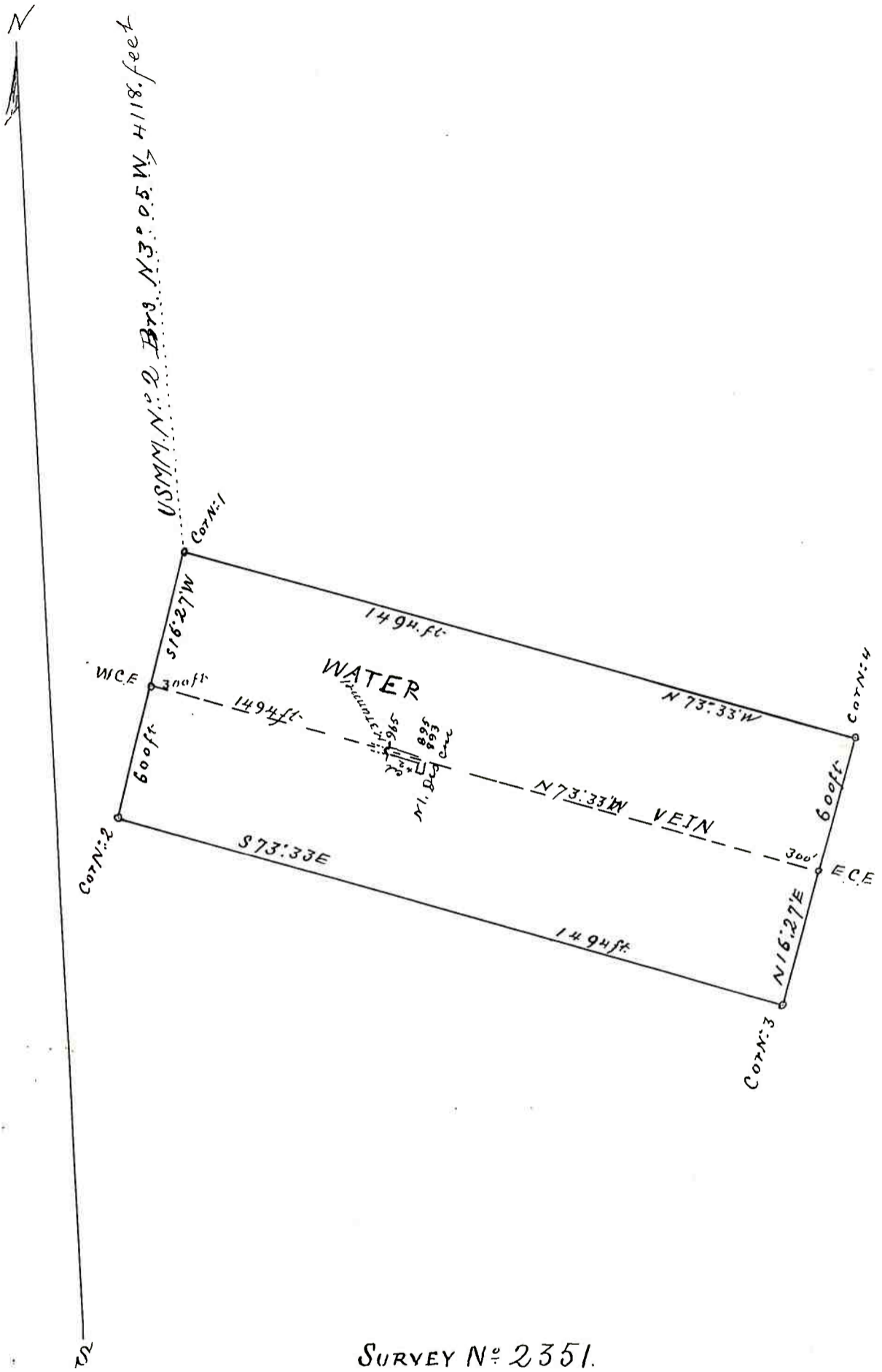
