A reconnaissance survey and triangulation demonstrates beyond question that a tie line from the Copper Spar Lode and in fact from any of the various lodes embraced in Survey No. 2438 passes over extremely mountainous land, offers exceptional difficulties to survey, and renders impractical the connection of the various said corners with the existing U.S.M.M. No. 2006.

A tie line from the Copper Spar Lode to U.S.M.M.
