The southeast portion of the Storm Cloud lode is located in the northwest corner of section 19 and the southwest corner of section 18, T. 22 N. R. 17 W.; the balance of the claim, the northwest portion of the Storm Cloud lode, the Original New London lode and the Benton lode are located approximately in sections 13 and 24 T. 22 N. R. 18 W.

LEDGES.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as

determined by direct solar observation. The distances

were measured with a 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Note- I find the following errors in lines of former approved surveys. Survey No. 1689, Champion lode, line 4-1 S.  $59^{\circ} 32'$  E. and line 3-4 S.  $30^{\circ} 28'$  W. instead of S.  $61^{\circ} 10'$  E. and S.  $28^{\circ} 50'$  W. respectively. Of Original New London lode, line 1-2 N.  $27^{\circ} 24'$  E. 597.6 ft., line 2-3 N.  $62^{\circ} 30' 30''$  W. 1499.1 ft., line 3-4 S.  $27^{\circ} 24'$  W. and line 4-1 S.  $62^{\circ} 36'$  E. 1499.1 ft., instead of N.  $26^{\circ} 20'$  E. 600 ft., N.  $63^{\circ} 40'$  W. 1500 ft., S.  $26^{\circ} 40'$  W. and S.  $63^{\circ} 40'$  E. 1500 ft. respectively.

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Note- I ran North two miles, East two miles and South two miles from Cor. to sections 18, 19, 13 and 24 T. 22 N. Rs. 17 and 18 W. but was unable to find any section or quarter section corners on those lines.
